#### Abstract

Sean Dunagan Judicial Watch 425 Third St. SW Suite 800 Washington, DC 20024 Dear Mr. Dunagan: I write to you today regarding your Freedom of Information Law ("FOIL") request for the following records within the timeframe of December 14, 2012 to January 22, 2013:


1. Any and all records of communication between Mayor Bloomberg and/or Chief Advisor to the Mayor for Policy and Strategic Planning John Feinblatt and Mr. Mark Glaze, Director of Mayors Against Illegal Guns and a Principal at The Raben Group, LLC between December 14, 2012 and January 22, 2013 (as amended by Judicial Watch on July 10,2013 ).
2. Any and all records of communication between Mayor Bloomberg and/or any official, employee, or representative of the Office of the Mayor and Vice President Joe Biden and/or any official, employee, or representative of the Office of the Vice President of the United States.
3. Any and all records regarding, concerning, or related to the January 9, 2013 White House meeting attended by Chief Advisor to the Mayor for Policy and Strategic Planning John Feinblatt, Vice President Biden, Attorney General Eric Holder, and others. This request includes, but is not limited to, any and all notes, talking
points, briefing books, and internal memoranda produced in preparation for, during, and/or subsequent to the meeting.

Documents responsive to Items \# 2 and 3 of your request were produced to you on November 22, 2013. Please find enclosed records responsive to Item \#1 of your request. Please note that portions of the responsive records, such as cell phone numbers, personal email addresses, and information regarding an individual's candidacy for employment, have been redacted pursuant to FOIL Section $87(2)(b)$, which allows agencies to withhold information that "if disclosed would constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy."

Please also note that other portions of the responsive records, such as the contact information of certain individuals related to the Mayor's Against Illegal Guns initiative, have been redacted pursuant to FOIL Section $87(2)(\mathrm{f})$, which allows agencies to withhold information that "if disclosed could endanger the life or safety of any person." Indeed, recent events where individuals associated with this organization have been subject to threats, harassment, and other harm necessitate invoking this exemption.

This now completes our response and this letter, together with the letter of November 22, 2013, constitutes a final determination. I certify that you have now been provided with all non-exempt records responsive to your request which were located after a reasonable and diligent search. Pursuant to Public Officers Law section 89(4), you have thirty (30) days to appeal the full determination for all portions of your request. Any such appeal should be directed to the Records Access Appeals, Officer, currently Carol Robles-Roman, at the above address. Thank you.

Hickenlooper takes a risk with position on gun control debate

Commerce City resident is shooting at the indoor range of Firing-Line, Colorado's largest gun shop. (Hyoung Chang, The Denver Post) Faster than a speeding bullet, Gov. John Hickenlooper upended his image with the revelation Thursday he's open to debate on gun control when the legislative session opens next month.

Hickenlooper's comments stunned Republicans and Democrats alike, coming just a few months after the Aurora movie theater shooting when the Democratic governor told a national audience he doubted tougher gun laws would have stopped the shooter.

Critics accused Hickenlooper of flip flopping and questioned why he was taking such a political risk.
"I hope he's not in too much pain from the case of ideological whiplash he's suffering," said Dick Wadhams, former chairman of the Colorado Republican Party.

Outgoing state Rep. Edward Casso, a Commerce City Democrat who votes with Republicans on most gun issues, said he was stunned when he heard the governor told The Associated Press it was time for a discussion about gun control. "The governor has built this perception as a moderate," Casso said. "I think this changes that perception."
'enlooper doesn't think so.
hted out that only three weeks ago he was "shooting innocent pheasants" out of the sky with a 12-guage shotgun.
"After Aurora, I think I was pretty clear that it wasn't the appropriate time to have a discussion about gun control or our present regulations," he told The Denver Post. "I don't have a problem now having that discussion nor do I think it's a political risk to let people have an open discussion."

The governor said he hasn't take a position and can see arguments on both sides.
One gun-control group currently active in Colorado - Mayors Against Illegal Guns - says its co-founders, Michael Bloomberg and Thomas Menino, mayors of New York City and Boston, respectively - have not talked to the governor.
"We have 13 member mayors in Colorado and a state coordinator, and we meet fairly regularly with groups and elected officials who are focused on reducing gun violence," director Mark Glaze said Thursday.

Although a number of Republicans on Thursday were critical of Hickenlooper, other politicos said they doubted a discussion about armor-piercing assault weapons will push Hickenlooper into the liberal sphere. They note that the former businessman is still closely aligned with Republican movers and shakers, and that enviros are upset that Hickenlooper has taken positions that appear to side with oil-and-gas interests.

Hickenlooper was a brew-pub owner and political neophyte when he ran for Denver mayor in 2003, emerging from the back of the pack to win in a landslide. The post is nonpartisan but Hickenlooper took his apolitical image to a new level when he ran for governor in 2010 and rarely mentioned being a Democrat.

So Coloradans weren't exactly surprised when, in the aftermath of the July 20 theater shootings, the governor on CNN expressed skepticism that tougher gun laws would have stopped suspected gunman James Holmes' rampage.
"This person, if there were no assault weapons available, if there were no this or no that, this guy's going to find something, right?" he said.

Jon Caldara, president of the Independence Institute, a libertarian-conservative think tank in Denver, believes Hickenlooper handled the shooting "exquisitely," focusing on the victims and their families rather than scoring political points.
"It's a shame he decided to flip flop on the issue, and it's also too bad that he's not using this to delve into the real issue, which is mental health," Caldara said.

Hickenlooper's reception to a discussion about gun control comes at the same time some victims' families are pushing the issue.

Sandy and Lonnie Phillips, whose daughter, Jessica Ghawi, was killed in the shootings, appeared on CNN's "Piers Morgan Tonight" on Wednesday and urged elected officials to think seriously about placing added controls on firearms.
"It's a horrible state of affairs that we're in in America right now, and it really needs to be addressed," Sandy Phillips said.
"We are gun owners, and we believe in the Second Amendment," Lonnie Phillips said. "But we believe there needs to be a dialogue. Our country needs to talk about some type of gun control."

Tom Mauser, who became a vocal gun-control advocate after his son, Daniel, was killed at Columbine High School in 1999, said he participated in a conference call with family members of Aurora shooting victims this week.

Mauser declined to say who organized the call or what the over-arching goal was. But he said gun control was on many of the family members' minds, especially when it came to assault weapons.

The shooters in both the Aurora attack and the Clackamas Town Center mall attack in Oregon this week used militarystyle, semiautomatic rifles.
"There were quite a few voices who wanted to look at the gun issue," Mauser said of the call. "You can't ignore that."
After the Aurora shootings, a Denver Post poll found little support for expanding firearms regulations. That matches with a lack of interest in gun-control legislation in recent years at the state Capitol, where gun-control supporters have mostly worked to keep measures that loosen gun rules from passing. But Mauser, pointing to the state's recent legalization of marijuana, said public opinion can change quickly.
"I think people are seeing that you can support the Second Amendment without supporting assault weapons," Mauser said. "Yes, there's a certain (political) risk. But there's also a risk in ignoring the issue. The public is clearly raising some questions about assault weapons."

## Obama's Cautious Call for Action Sets Stage to Revive Gun Debate

WASHINGTON - In the emotional statement on the Newtown shootings that President Obama delivered from the White House on Friday, it was a single line, spoken as much in anger as in grief, that stood out. The words were cautious and were immediately criticized for being too timid. But they may have signaled that the longdormant debate over the nation's gun laws is about to be re-engaged.
"We're going to have to come together and take meaningful action to prevent more tragedies like this, regardless of the politics," Mr. Obama said, listing the devastation wrought by other gun violence, from a recent attack in an Oregon shopping mall to the shootings in a movie theater in Aurora, Colo., in July.

But Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg of New York spoke for many gun-control advocates, who have been frustrated and disappointed by Mr. Obama's failure to embrace the issue, when he said he wanted to hear much more.
"Calling for 'meaningful action' is not enough. We need immediate action," said Mr. Bloomberg, who is a leader of a group of mayors against illegal gun ownership.
"We have heard all the rhetoric before," Mr. Bloomberg added. "What we have not seen is leadership - not from the White House and not from Congress. That must end today."

White House officials professed not to know what Mr. Obama's pledge for "meaningful action" meant. But given Mr. Obama's methodical style, the words were not likely to have been chosen casually. And yet the president stopped short of detailing any new initiatives, like restrictions on high-capacity ammunition magazines or stricter bans on gun buyers with a history of mental illness.

Pressed about whether Mr. Obama would use the tragedy to fuel a new effort, the White House spokesman. Jay Carney, said the administration did not want to politicize a tragedy. "There is I'm sure - will be, rather, a day for discussion of the usual Washington policy debates, but I don't think today is that day," he said before Mr. Obama made his remarks.

Politics, of course, intruded almost immediately. Mr. Bloomberg's group organized a vigil in front of the White House to demand that the president take action. On Capitol Hill, there was an outpouring of condolences and a predictably partisan split on how to respond.

Republicans and many moderate Democrats expressed their horror at the mass killing, but were either silent on a legislative response or said it was not time to talk about gun control. But liberal Democrats said it was time to move forward with serious gun laws.
"The time to talk about it should have been after the last shooting or the shooting before that," said Representative Carolyn McCarthy, Democrat of New York, whose husband was one of six people killed in a shooting on the Long Island Rail Road in 1993.

Ms. McCarthy said she would resume her quest for broad gun violence legislation: reinstating the assault weapons ban that expired in 2004; banning high-capacity magazines; requiring criminal background checks on gun buyers at gun shows; and improving instant background checks to more thoroughly catch people with histories of mental illness.
"I'm not going to be shy anymore," she said.
As the debate over gun control flares anew, it is likely to focus on the types of two of the guns that were found with the suspect in Connecticut, a Glock pistol and a Bushmaster . 223 M 4 carbine rifle, which are similar in type to the weapons used in the mass shootings in Oregon and Colorado.

Both guns are popular for target shooting and self-defense, and have been singled out by gun-control advocates because of their ability to rapidly fire multiple rounds and accommodate large magazines.

But Republicans said tighter gun-control measures would be the wrong step.
"That's one thing I hope doesn't happen," said Representative Mike Rogers, a senior Michigan Republican who is a former F.B.I. agent. "That's certainly the lowest common denominator. What is the more realistic discussion is, how do we target people with mental illness who use firearms?"

Kristen Rand, the legislative director for the Violence Policy Center, a gun-control advocacy group, said it was too early to say whether the Newtown massacre would yield different political results than previous mass shootings, including the attack that nearly took the life of a member of Congress, Gabrielle Giffords of Arizona.

But she said she believes it would for two reasons: the victims were children, which has elicited a gutwrenching response across the country, and the National Rifle Association proved to be a political paper tiger in the 2012 election.

David Chipman, a former special agent at the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives who is now a consultant to Mayors Against Illegal Guns, said he believed the shooting was "a game changer."
"The only thing that I personally experienced that was similar to this moment was the Oklahoma City bombing. where another American killed scores of people," Mr. Chipman said of his 25-year career.

Mr. Obama advocated gun laws days after the shooting in Aurora on July 20, but he did not break new ground in proposing legislation, and he reaffirmed his belief in the constitutional rights of gun owners. In a speech to the National Urban League in New Orleans, Mr. Obama endorsed tighter restrictions to bar mentally unstable people from buying weapons. Officials say the suspect in the Newtown massacre suffered from personality disorders.
"These steps shouldn't be controversial," Mr. Obama said in his speech in July. "They should be common sense."

Gun control, however, played an incidental role in the presidential campaign. And the political prospects for federal gun legislation remain bleak, analysts said, even with the national outpouring of emotion that lypically follows mass killings.

Given that, some advocates said Mr. Obama should focus on steps that he could do through an executive order. Like Presidents Bill Clinton and the elder George Bush, he could ban the import of assault rifles like AK gun, which have been used in shooting massacres.

More ambitious steps could include passing national legislation to toughen background checks, which are not currently required for guns bought from unlicensed, private sellers.

Authorities in Orange County said shots were fired at a mall in Newport Beach on Saturday during the busy shopping season before Christmas

One man was in custody after the sound of gunshots caused near-pandemonium, according to shoppers. No one was injured, authorities said.

Newport Beach police said the shots were fired in a parking lot outside the Macy's at Fashion Island mall at about $4: 30$ p.m. They said one person was in custody and confirmed the mall had been placed on lockdown

Aerial video showed a portion of the mall parking lot taped off with yellow police tape, and evidence markers were placed throughout the area

Several people at the Nordstrom and other stores told NBC4 that they had been on lockdown. Several said they heard the gunshots

More than 50 rounds were fired, a Newport Beach Police Department spokesman told the Los Angeles Times. The newspaper also reported that a 42-year-old male was arrested by officers on bike patrol A YouTube user posted video from the parking lot in which repeated shots can be heard.
"I couldn't see who was shooting, but I started to take video in the direction the shots came from while standing behind the car you see in the foreground," the caption said. "My video catches the last two clips he shot and I could finally see him when he shot off the last clip."

Shopper Joe Rubbinaccio told NBC4 he was on the lowest floor of Macy's when he heard shouting.
"I heard somebody yelling. It sounds like an employee. He was saying, 'Lock the store down!' And he was yelling, 'Don't panic. There's been a shooting,'" Rubbinaccio said. "At that point, you kind of freeze. Your heart skips a beat. ... You just panic, you don't know what to do."
Rubbinaccio said he saw many people running, and others said they had heard 10 to 20 shots. Rubbinaccio got away from the scene safely, and had heard one person had been injured in the rush to escape.

Police stopped releasing details after answering initial inquiries.
There were many accounts on Twitter about a man with a gun at the mall.
"My mom, son, and I are shopping at Fashion Island and we heard gun shots we're hiding in the restroom," tweeted @Jennicake.
Fashion Island is an upscale open-air mall in Newport Beach, an affluent coastal community. The mall is located at 401 Newport Center Drive (map).
The incident came as many across the country were on high alert following a horrific mass shooting Friday at an elementary school in Connecticut that killed 26, including 20 children.

Multiple vigils had been planned Saturday to mourn the victims of the shooting in Newtown, Conn., including an event at the Wilshire Federal Building in Westwood that was focused on gun control.

He is the institution who cannot act like one, the silver-haired Speaker of the House who quotes Winston Churchill in the other Washington but is forced to shoulder a buffalo rifle here to prove he is still Tom Foley of eastern Washington.
Trying to save a 30 -year Congressional career in his run for re-election, Mr. Foley has endured an unusual number of onion-smothered chili dogs, insinuations that because he has no children he is out of touch with the concerns of families, and disgruntled questions about why he built a million-dollar house on the East Coast and not in Spokane, where he owns a co-op apartment.

Gone for the moment are the stiff lectures to high school students on the origins of representative government. For Thomas S. Foley, who clearly loves Congress, who has spent a third of a century studying and reveling in its nuances and who as Speaker stands third in line to the Presidency, this may be the most painful month of a distinguished political life.
But it may also be the strong medicine he needed. After beginning the campaign passively against a political unknown and falling as much as 18 percentage points behind in the polls, Mr. Foley has scrambled back. Today both
he and his Republican rival, George Nethercutt, a 50-year-old Spokane lawyer, say their polls show the race to be a dead heat.

To get to this point, Mr. Foley has suffered indignities that were unheard of in his campaigns of yesteryear. For one thing, there are fewer and fewer people around who know that he is the son of Ralph and Helen Foley -- the father a judge, the mother a community leader -- who were so revered that their names are chiseled into the biggest new building at Gonzaga University, near the statue of Bing Crosby, who was a student there. Today talk radio hosts here call Mr. Foley things that are unprintable.

The 65 -year-old Speaker seems perplexed by the degree and the nature of the change he sees on the American political landscape. Talk radio is "abusive and slanderous," he said in an interview. General press coverage, he said, "has become overwhelmingly negative."

In 15 previous campaigns as the Democratic Representative from Washington's Fifth Congressional District, Mr. Foley rarely broke a sweat. Not so this year.

With a display of sudden urgency, he is trying to avoid an awful historical footnote that would identify him as the first Speaker since William Pennington of New Jersey in 1860 to be voted out of office.

But in trying to persuade the voters to choose him again, he faces this central conundrum: Defending Congress gets him nowhere at a time when, national surveys find, only one person in five has any faith in it to do the right thing, and yet he must defend the legislative system that has made him its leader, or at least explain how his Speakership works to his constituents' benefit.

Interviews here and other anecdotal evidence suggest that a fair number of voters in this district do not know that by voting out Mr. Foley they would give up the Speakership, and with it the Speaker's power to make sure that, for example, the farmers of the region continue to receive huge subsidies, or that the area continues to have the cheapest Federal electric rates in the country. (The Federal Government supplies almost all the area's power.) So Mr. Foley's campaign is spending more than $\$ 1.5$ million on a high-stakes civics lesson. His television advertisements declare repeatedly that Mr. Nethercutt's first vote in Congress would be to move the Speakership from Spokane to Marietta, Ga., the home of Representative Newt Gingrich, now the House Republican whip. Mr. Nethercutt's response illustrates that old principles of political logic do not necessarily apply this year. The challenger is seeking votes by asking the beneficiaries of Federal largesse to reject the Congressman who got it for them, all in the name of sending a message of complaint about how Congress operates.

The roads that Mr. Foley has helped to restore, the air base he saved, the police officers he delivered to Spokane, all of these are pork, Mr. Nethercutt says. Mocking the Speaker's power, Mr. Nethercutt carries around a pocket-sized pink pig -- "the best little friend" of Mr. Foley, as he calls the toy.

Analysts -- both locals and outsiders -- seem astonished that voters here might be willing to give up the Speaker's influence in order to send a message of contempt for Congress.
"What we've got are two parts ignorance, one part cynicism and one part novelty," said Dr. Robert Herold. a professor of government at Eastern Washington University.

Republicans are pressing the theme that Mr. Foley's power is corrupting, and not worth all that much anyway.
"Get a life, take care of your own needs," William J. Bennett, the Reagan Administration's Education Secretary. said in a speech in Spokane this week. He accused Mr. Foley of practicing "the politics of bribery."

Replied Mr. Foley: "That is an extraordinary statement to make in this city. It is insulting." But being on the receiving end of insults is, in large part, what the campaign of 1994 is about for old Congressional powers.
The establishment here is still respectful of the Speaker. The Spokesman-Review, the leading newspaper here and long a center of Republican power, gave him a strong endorsement last Sunday, saying he was "the sort of man most Americans would love to have as their Congressman, a prodigious intellect, a man of unusual integrity."

But now Mr. Foley runs into the occasional heckler at speeches and is vilified at all times of the day on the radio. He is criticized as too erudite, too intellectual -- to which he replies, "I don't intend to change my style or my manner."

The actor Charlton Heston has come out against Mr. Foley in a television advertisement for the National Rifle Association. And Mr. Nethercutt, in a debate against Mr. Foley this morning before 850 people at a Chamber of Commerce gathering, suggested that the incumbent did not understand the concerns of families. Four times the challenger spoke the words "I'm a dad," leaving unsaid that Mr. Foley is not. The strategy, said Terry Holt, a spokesman for Mr. Nethercutt, is to show that "Tom Foley is not like the rest of us."
In past election campaigns, Mr. Foley seldom mentioned his challenger's name. This year he has, in negative ads.
And to counter the National Rifle Association's ads, he put on a plaid shirt the other day and went out to a firing range, where he shot a few rounds with an old buffalo rifle -- this by a candidate who is known for having once shown up at a summer rodeo in an English-tailored suit.

Mr. Foley may have been handed a gift when the N.R.A. decided to attack his support of the assault-rifle ban included in the Clinton Administration's recently enacted anticrime legislation. With polls showing people here favoring the ban by 2 to 1, Mr. Foley is running advertisements that remind voters of what happened in Spokane earlier this summer, when a man with an assault rifle killed four people and wounded more than 20.

In an interview, Mr. Foley spoke warmly of the institution others now revile. But he expresses such sentiments in private conversation, not in speeches. Speaking well of Congress on the stump could prove irreparably damaging this year, especially for someone who has become the living symbol of the institution.
Still, some experts say Mr. Foley should defy prevailing political wisdom. Making a case for respecting the top job in Congress and what it represents, these experts say, is Mr. Foley's best hope of holding on.
"I have to think that on Election Day, Foley will pull it out," said Dr. Herold, the Eastern Washington professor. "I think enough of those people who now have George Nethercutt signs on their lawns will walk into the polling booth and say: 'What am I, crazy? Have I lost my marbles? Giving up the Speaker of the House?' "

A Fox News contributor who network CEO Roger Alles reportedly uses to communicate his views on-air suggested that he might support new gun laws in the wake of the Newtown massacre

Peter Johnson, Jr., a Fox News legal analyst, said that "the government has the right to register and regulate... firearms" and suggested that we should consider restricting ownership of assault weapons in light of recent events during a monologue on the December 18 edition of Fox \& Friends.

JOHNSON: People have the right under the Second Amendment to own firearms. The government has the right to register and regulate those firearms. At the same time we need to be thinking about where should we be allocating law enforcement resources. How can we better register?
$[\ldots]$
Let's look at AK-47s and AR-15s. The numbers show that it's a small portion of the deaths and violence in America. But it's a high portion, it's a high proportion of these mass violence episodes. Let's look at everything in a dispassionate, smart, objective way that protects Americans and protects the Constitution both.

During the same segment, Johnson suggested that Americans should also examine the "entertainment industry" because of their support for "videos." The Washington Post has noted that data show no correlation between video game spending per capita and gun-related homicides.

Johnson's role at Fox is reportedly much greater than a typical contributor. In addition to his regular appearances on Fox \& Friends, Johnson serves as Alles' personal attomey, confers regularly with the Fox chief and is reportedly the outlet Alles uses to channel his views on the network.

New York magazine's Gabriel Sherman reported in October:
[IIf you want to know what Roger Ailes really thinks about the news these days, here's a tip: Pay close attention to Peter Johnson Jr., Fox News's legal analyst. The Columbia-educated lawyer is certainly not as familiar to most viewers as Bill O'Reilly or Sean Hannity, but inside the network, Johnson has become, in many respects, more influential, thanks to his ties to Alles. To understand Fox right now, you have to understand the unique role Peter Johnson Jr. has come to play in Ailes's inner circle.

Consider this: Johnson is an on-air pundit, weighing in on topics as varied as Trayvon Martin. Occupy Wall Street, Obamacare, and Benghazi. He is a regular fillin host on Fox \& Friends. And he is Alles's personal attomey who negotiated the network chief's new four-year contract with News Corp., said to be worth upward of $\$ 30$ million a year. Fox executives frequently find Johnson conferring with Ailes privately. "He is a fixture in Alies's office. one Fox source explained

But Johnson's value to Alles extends far beyond his work as a lawyer. This election season. when Alles has a message to communicate, chances are that it is Johnson who articulates it on air.

Johnson's appearance suggests that Ailes may want to move Fox away from the network's routine demonization of calls to strengthen gun laws and toward more responsible coverage of the issue of gun violence.

## Governor McDonnell calls for consideration of arming teachers and principals

In response to questions about the horrific tragedy at Sandy Hook Elementary on his "Ask the Governor" segment on WTOP Radio this morming, Governor Bob McDonnell suggested Virginia arm teachers, principals. and other school staff. Yesterday, when asked about the tragedy, the Governor said it was "way to early" to being talking about new gun policies. For audio of the exchange, click here.
"One of the reasons this tragedy has hit us so hard is because in America we hold our schools sacred as safe places for learning, opportunity, growth," said ProgressVA Executive Director Anna Scholl. "There is just no reason for there to be guns in schools. Period. Instead of forcing our teachers to carry weapons and our children to live in fear every day, we should let them focus on teaching and learning and demand that our leaders worry about keeping dangerous weapons off the streets and out of the hands of criminals."

Contrary to assertions by the National Rifle Association and their allies, the evidence shows more guns equal more deaths and more tragedy. Nearly ninety percent of NRA members -- actual gun owners -- agree that support for Second Amendment rights goes hand-in-hand with keeping guns out of the hands of criminals, 34 Americans are murdered with guns every day.

Our leaders have watched the bloodshed for years without taking any of the common sense steps that wo know will reduce gun violence -- requiring a criminal background check for every sale; banning military-style assault weapons and high-cap magazines; and making gun trafficking a federal crime. These are the kinds of steps Americans have been clamoring for leadership on, and this is what our leaders should do now.

Federal law doesn't currently require a background check for private gun sales at places like gun shows or over the internet -- which account for forty percent of sales. Eighty percent of inmates surveyed got their guns through private transfers. According to law enforcement, closing this loophole is the single most important thing to do start saving lives. One quarter of gun crimes and one third of police murders involve high capacity magazines.

Mayors, Brady Group Try to Swing Pendulum on Guns By Janie Lorber, CQ Roll Call
In the aftermath of the Dec. 14 massacre at a Connecticut elementary school, Mayors Against Illegal Guns earned the support of 13 more mayors, including several Republicans, raised tens of thousands of dollars, and lined up dozens of celebrities and technology executives to promote its cause.

Meanwhile, the Brady Campaign to Prevent Gun Violence and 32 families of mass shooting victims sent a letter to lawmakers and President Barack Obama demanding stricter gun laws.

Tragedies such as last week's shooting provide a powerful emotional rallying point that gun control activists hope will finally tip the scales against better-funded, more politically influential gun rights groups. And the group best positioned to take advantage of any shift may be mayors, who can exert pressure on state legislatures and build support for their cause outside Washington, D.C.

In recent years, the Brady Campaign to Prevent Gun Violence has spent no more than $\$ 40,000$ annually lobbying Congress and has had just one lobbyist on staff, while the National Rifle Association and other gun rights groups draw on hundreds of millions of dollars to pressure lawmakers on the Hill and at the ballot box.

The Brady Campaign - named for President Ronald Reagan's press secretary, Jim Brady, who was permanently disabled in a 1981 assassination attempt - has for decades been the public face of gun control. But its footprint may soon be eclipsed by Mayors Against Illegal Guns, a nonprofit led by New York Mayor Michael Bloomberg.

The mayors' group has only spent a touch more than the Brady Campaign - about $\$ 150,000$ per year - but it is bolstered by Bloomberg's high profile, billionaire war chest and new super PAC that spent $\$ 8.2$ million targeting gunfriendly lawmakers in the 2012 election cycle.

In the three days following the shooting, the mayors' group raised nearly $\$ 80,000$ from small donors plus "some significant checks," said Mark Glaze, a lobbyist at the Raben Group who represents the organization.

While the Brady Campaign has been focused on federal activity, Bloomberg and the mayors are taking their cause to state legislatures, with the support of a growing network of hundreds of local officials and law enforcement groups.
"We learned relatively quickly that [the NRA is] so used to being unopposed the state level," Glaze said. "That is one path to victory."

He cited a recent victory in Michigan, where a coalition led by mayors helped defeat an NRA-backed bill that would have eliminated state-mandated background checks for all gun sales and dismantled a database that tracked transactions.
"Our team swung into action," Glaze said. "We sent an organizer; we arranged a press conference, got the police together; we got our grass roots going ... and the NRA suffered this humiliating defeat."

The bill, which easily passed the Michigan House of Representatives in June, died in the Senate after lawmakers voted for an alternate measure that retained the criminal background checks.

A separate bill passed the state legislature the day before the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting that would allow gun owners to receive eight additional hours of training to carry their weapons in formerly gun-free areas. Michigan Republican Gov. Rick Snyder vetoed the bill Tuesday.

Bloomberg's group does not focus on concealed-carry laws. Instead, it is fighting for background checks in all gun sales, including by private vendors, a new ban on assault weapons and high capacity magazines and stronger penalties for those who buy guns on behalf of those who don't have clean records.

Among the group's newest members are the mayors of Raleigh, N.C.; Tucson, Ariz.; Oak Creek, Wis.; and Maryville, Tenn., the birthplace of NRA-endorsed GOP Sen. Lamar Alexander.

Pamela Gilbert, a consumer advocacy lobbyist with Cuneo Gilbert \& LaDuca LLP, said the groups would benefit from deeper coordination.
"Target and focus on the NRA as you would a corporate bad guy, not like another nonprofit or another policy group," she said.

This is a memo on ways to sustain a campaign to gain comprehensive gun control as a national policy and deal with related ways to combat the culture of violence. This is not a memo about what the right policies will be: I expect to see reasonable proposals on tracking gun purchases, assualt weapons, loading of weapons, mental health services and perhaps matters dealing with violent games and videos.
The focus here is on building and sustaining a concerted effort that will outlast the gun lobby, the gun manufacturers and their hedge fund and wall st. allies.
Many of the suggestions and observations come from spending time since the sandy Hook kiling talking with lots of people who are in gun control work, providing mental health services, work in technology, work with children, journalists and concerned people who want to be part of creating change.
I. Understanding where we Are Historically

More than anything else the period reminds me of the efforts made after Bull Connor and Birmingham when JFK came up with a comprehensive civil rights policy, with significant advances and omissions. What the civil rights and labor movement leadership understood so well then is that it was not enough for the president to propose, prioritize his proposals and expect something constructive to happen. It would take an engage citizenry that: prodded and pushed the administration not to lose focus, a concerted effort to win over the undecided legislators with original and unexpected voices.
original and unexpected voices is what happened. AS LBJ succeeded JFK, those voices served as LBJ's force to not in any serious way weaken the civil rights legislative efforts. In every respect it succeeded. The civil rights forces had independence from the Executive and Legislative branches, yet it built valued relationships among government and elected officials. It engaged in steady campaigning, prodding, supporting and cheering public officials who earned the plaudits. Thecivil rights forces campaigned steadily and creatively.
How can that be repeated? That is our challenge. I am proposing that we learn from the civil rights movement of 1963-65.
At that time the protestant clergy, many from small town America, and the catholic hierarchy and priests from economically deprived areas made a huge difference. There was an added weapon. African-American and caucasian women and men camefrom southern states and adopted an Page 1

Cohen Gun Violence memo Dec 2012 undecided Senator from other states to give the reasons why the civil rights legislation was essential, and what they were experiencing in their community and why southern white and black people wanted to end discrimination and segregation. I know. I was their briefer.
II. Understabnding where we Are Now

Sandy Hook/Newtown has led to something being different. There's lots of activity: Michael Bloomberg's 700 mayors, Mayors Against Illegal Guns, Brady Campaign to Prevent Gun violence and other organizations. The framing of the issue that we must protect children from gun violence stands out. So does its being a public health issue. That will add pediatricians and other health professionals to the effort.

A new advantage is what has properly been called the deranged press conference of the NRA.

Bottom line: this is all too important to be left to each of the individual organizations to carry the fight.

Needed is a Coalition of Responsibles who will fill the role of the protestant and Catholic clergy, and the African-American and white citizens from southern states, who together advocated for civil rights.

Such a coalition will draw people in who have not advocated before but are ready to now. They can be a structured netowrk of responsibility.

Names that others have suggested for such a coalition is:
Not in vain,
Enough is Enough
Never Again.
Whatever name is taken such an effort must be first convened by those with standing. This includes Mayor Bloomberg and it should draw on diverse sectors of our society. Certainly the clergy, who played an important inclusive role in the connecticut tragedy, should be part of the assemblage.

## III. Powerful and/or Unexpected Advocates

1. In a service at the National Cathedral in washington $D C$, the suffragan Bishop reminded the congregants that there is great power in the cross. There is, as there is in other religious symbols, when focused in behalf of something specific that asks a decision maker to act.
2. Other powerful combinations are Mothers and their children who together focus on elected officials. Think of the power of Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) and you see where I am headed. They turned the teen alchoholissue around and in particular beat the beer lobby.
3. Such advocacy does not have to be limited to mothers and their children. It can include fathers and their children and grandparents and their grandchildren.
4. I have seen brilliantly effective advocacy, direct and symbolic advocacy, by children all through South Asia and southern africa. It occurred in our own civil rights work. Just go to the Page 2

Cohen Gun Violence memo Dec 2012
states of the old Confederacy and you will hear many stories of effective advocacy by children. The current inter-generational aspect adds constructively to the emotion.
5. An organizing effort must be made to tap into the Networks of Responsibility in rural areas and in small town America. Such advocates provide a powerful answer to the view that all rural areas and small towns are monolithic on this issue. They are not. Their presence must be organized and felt. They can convince the undecideds, those who will need to be pushed, and play the role of Black and white southern citizens played in the 1960 s .
IV. Role of vertical Groups

Vertical groups such as the Fraternal order of police, police Chiefs, other law enforcement organizations can play a critical role in identifying effective advocates and spokes people in rural and small town areas. Mental health and education professionals can do the same. This can be a singular contribution by all constituencies that do so.

As important is the role of Sportsmen, Hunters, The wildiffe Federation and dissenting NRA members (who may well be a majority) for all to speak out and with it engage people from small towns and rural areas who are their members.
V. What we Have Learned Since the 1960s

1. The technology community went ballistic on Stop on Line Piracy act (SOPA)-arguably adversely affecting the industry's interest. So far it has been substantially silent since connecticut. It can create a buzz, provide space for sustained advocacy. silicon valley, New York City, Route 128 and other centers should add to the discussion and be part of the mix. It should meet a challenge it so far has not met.
2. Invariably a gun control fight will be filled with viral like lies and rumors. In the 2008 and 2012 elections the obama campaign had a dream team of social science experts to combat false rumors. People such as Craig Fox, Sasha Issenberg, Sam Popkin, Craig Rogers and others can be brought into the discussions on what to anticipate and how best to counter the lies and rumors.
3. An added, and necessary approach, would engage the Framework Institute and Susan Bales. Bales has pioneered groups to apply strategic frame aanlysis to advocacy campaigns. The Framework Institute, in this new approach to strategic framework analysis, focuses on howpeople understand and perceive an issue in order to understandthe advantages and challenges the advocates face.

## VI. Conclusion

This memo is meant to represent a beginning of a conversation that should lead faster than slower to a campaign that focuses on overcoming gun violence and gives us a very different result from what the NRA has proposed.

## INTRODUCTION

Purpose creates new social ventures that leverage digital technology and mass participation. We have a strong track record of success of launching and collaborating with movement organizations across multiple issue areas, including education reform, LGBT rights, civil liberties, global poverty, and campaign finance.

For the past two years, we've been thinking about applying these movement lessons to address gun violence, and the events of recent weeks have accelerated our thinking. For the first time in memory, we see hope in the political process - but we also know that opponents of gun control are biding their time. They know we have historically failed to establish an organized, active, and durable mass-movement to keep up the pressure and counter the NRA and industry once the headlines have faded. Now is our opportunity to establish the broad-based movement we need.

## A 21st CENTURY MOVEMENT

Existing organizations such as Mayors Against Illegal Guns and the Brady Campaign are the leaders in this space and represent the key partners for any new efforts. We see a gap though, in the lack of a broad-based, mass-member movement using modern online organizing techniques to engage in political, social, and cultural interventions.

A 21 st century movement will require:

1) An accessible, people-powered brand that signals a fresh, powerful approach that brings Americans together to work toward a safer future;
2) A digital strategy that leverages politics, media, culture, and corporations as potential leverage points for campaigns that can build a movement reaching beyond politics and into all parts of society;
3) Scale. While existing groups have core memberships of dedicated
members, the landscape is missing an active mass movement that can simultaneously engage in states and federal legislative battles, work to change our culture, and conduct consumer campaigns that relate to gun violence.

## STRATEGIC RECOMMENDATIONS

Millions of Americans are looking - right now - to engage in tackling this problem. But the desire to show respect for Newtown victims and their families and the need to react strategically with long-term objectives in mind counsel caution.

We can use this moment to put fundamental building blocks in place to put a stake in the ground around what we are doing, begin building our email list, and position our work as a new approach.

Our recommendation is to begin a strategy workstream while, in parallel, executing some "rapid-start" ideas to start assembling the movement:

- The strategy workstream would develop the brand, goals, and strategy for this new movement by utilizing our deep experience in launching movements, using the strategies and lessons that worked for AllOut, unPAC, and our other work.
- In parallel, we can run a quick-start petition campaign to keep the pressure on President Obama. This petition campaign would ask Obama to publicly declare his support for one or more of the key action tenets of Demand A Plan. However, the campaign would differ from existing efforts by including video assets (mashups of Obama statements with historical presidential statements on guns), shareable social media content (designed specifically for mass appeal), creative petition delivery that highlights our theory of change, and all the campaigning components of the Purpose toolkit. Key moments in this campaign include the Presidential Inauguration, the State of the Union, and the likely introduction of the Assault Weapons Ban in the U.S. Senate.

We are also working on other possible ideas to use in the future. Though these ideas are not yet sufficiently refined to be actionable, they include:

- A public engagement site asking the public for their ideas in addressing gun violence - to create a crowd-sourced solution set with "up-voting" as a lower bar engagement ask.
- Establishing a public memorial site where visitors can leave virtual flowers and condolence messages for gun violence victims, with a soft email ask to help grow the movement.

Both actions would help acquire emails and facilitate social media shares.

## NEXT STEPS

Identifying the right partners for this work is the key next step. Our work building movements requires not only partners to properly resource the work, but also to develop strong campaigns that lead to impact and membership growth.

Once partners are selected, we're ready to begin the simultaneous execution of the strategy work and the rapid-launch outlined in this document.

Hi all,
As you might imagine, we've been incredibly busy the past 10 days in response to the Newtown shooting and expect to stay busy for at least a few months. Thank you so much for stepping in and helping with urgent projects during the holiday season. I have a couple of questions for you as we ramp up:
(1) Mayors Against Illegal Guns Action Fund will likely to bring on several people to help with urgent, short-term campaign tasks, including lobbying, digital production, organizing. These will be short-term contracts (likely 3 months) and not long term employment offers. As our public profile grows and scrutiny of our work intensifies, want to make sure we're properly vetting volunteers and short term staff. We already have people sign an NDA when they join our office. What else should we do? Is there a standard process on other campaigns? I want the process to be efficient but I also want it to screen out potential industry moles and people whose social media presence or background might be a liability to us.
(2) We will have an initial rush of legal and management work to bring these people on board, check them, get their paperwork processed, NDAs signed, read them the riot act about confidentiality, etc. Do you know of a trusted lawyer who can step in and help with this, possibly pro bono? । imagine it could be a short-term or part-time engagement as we go through an initial hiring phase.

## The N.R.A. at the Bench

There has been plenty written about the National Rifle Association in recent days. But nothing that l've seen has focused on the gun lobby's increasingly pernicious role in judicial confirmations. So here's a little story.

Back in 2009, when President Obama chose Judge Sonia Sotomayor as his firs Supreme Court nominee, the White House expected that her compelling personal story, sterling credentials, and experience both as a prosecutor and, for 17 years, as a federal judge would win broad bipartisan support for her nomination. There was, in fact, no plausible reason for any senator to vote against her.

The president's hope was Senator Mitch McConnell's fear. In order to shore up his caucus, the Senate Republican leader asked a favor of his friends at the National Rille

Association: oppose the Sotomayor nomination and, furthermore, "score" the confirmation vote. An interest group "scores" a vote when it adds the vote on a particular issue to the legislative scorecard it gives each member of Congress at the end of the session. In many states, an N.R.A. score of less than 100 for an incumbent facing reelection is big trouble.

Note that the N.R.A. had never before scored a judicial confirmation vote. Note also that Sonia Sotomayor had no record on the N.R.A.'s issues. (True, she voted with an appeals court panel to uphold New York State's ban on nunchucks, a martial-arts weapon consisting of two sticks held together with a chain or rope, commonly used by pang members and muggers. The appeals court didn't even reach the interesting issue of whether the Second Amendment guaranteed the right to keep and bear nunch cks, ruling instead that the amendment didn't apply to the states - which, before the Supreme Court later ruled otherwise by a vote of 5 to 4 , it didn't.)

Never mind. The N.R.A. had all the reason it needed to oppose Sonia Sotomayor: maintenance of its symbiotic relationship with the Republican Party. Once it announced its opposition and its intention to score the vote, Republican support for the nominee melted away. Only seven Republicans voted for confirmation.

One senator, Lisa Murkowski of Alaska, said by way of explaining her "no" vote that her constituents had expressed "overwhelming concern" about Judge Sotomayor's views on the Second Amendment. However, Senator Murkowski told the National Journal at the time, "I am a bit concerned that the N.R.A. weighed in and said they were going to score this." She added, "I don't think that was appropriate."

The following year, after the N.R.A. opposed Elena Kagan for the Supreme Court and announced that "this vote matters and will be part of future candidate evaluations," Republican support for another nominee without a record on gun issues shrank to five senators.

At least Supreme Court confirmation debates take place in the light of day. Mernbers of the public can tune in and decide whether they are persuaded that Elena Kagan represents "a clear a present danger to the right to keep and bear arms," to quote the N.R.A.'s statement of opposition to her nomination. (Justice Kagan had never owned or shot a gun, but since joining the court has taken lessons and gone hunting with Justice Antonin Scalia, pronouncing the experience"kind of fim.")

But the N.R.A. has begun to involve itself in lower court nominations as well, where it can work its will in the shadows. It has effectively blocked President Obama's nomination of Caitlin J. Halligan to a seat on the United States Court of Appeals for the District of

Columbia Circuit that has been vacant since September 2005, when John G. Roberts Jr. moved to a courthouse up the street. The president has submitted the name of the superbly qualified Ms. Halligan to the Senate three times.

When the Democrats' effort to break a Republican filibuster failed last year, Senator Murkowski was the only Republican to vote for cloture, perhaps liberated by the fact that she won her last election as a write-in candidate, thus freeing herself of party discipline which in the Republicans' case effectively means discipline by the N.R.A. In this year's Republican Senate primary in Indiana, the N.R.A. spent $\$ 200,000$ toward the successful effort to defeat the incumbent, Richard Lugar, attacking the six torm senator for, among other sins, having voted to confirm "both of Barack Obama's anti-gun nominers to the U.S. Supreme Court."

When I wrote a year ago about the fate of Caitlin Halligan's appeals court nomination, I tried to puzzle out the basis for the opposition. Silly me, I thought it had something to do with Republicans not wanting a young (she had just turned 45), highly qualified judge sitting in the D.C. Circuit's famous launch position (hello, John Roberts, Ruth Bader Ginsburg, Antonin Scalia, Clarence Thomas, Warren Burger . . .)

Now I realize it's not about anything so sophisticated. It's about the N.R.A.,
which ammounced its opposition days before the cloture vote last December. It was only the second time in the organization's history that it had opposed a nomination at the nonSupreme Court level. (The first was Abner Mikva in 1979, a former member of Congress from Chicago who won confirmation and who later served as President Bill Clinton's White House counsel.) In a previous job as New York State's solicitor general, Ms. Halligan, a former Supreme Court law clerk who is now general counsel to the Manhattan district attorney, had represented the state in a lawsuit against gun manufacturers. So much for her.

So that's my N.R.A. story. The question is what anyone can do about it. The N.R.A. has embedded itself so deeply into the culture of Republican politics that it would take a cataclysm to break the bonds of money and fear that keep Republican office holders captive to the gun lobby's agenda.

Well, a cataclysm just occurred, a few dozen miles from my off ce at Yale Law School. (My late father-in-law was born on a farm in the Sandy Hook neighborhood of New own.) There will be legislative proposals, and members of the Senate and House will dohate them, maybe even enact a few, and people back home can decide what they think. How to get a handle on the gun problem is not my point. Rather, I want to offer the judicial nomination story as a canary in the mine, a warning about the depths to which the power of the gun lobby has brought the political system.

My point is this: It is totally unacceptable for the N.R.A., desperate to hang on to its mission and its members after achieving its Second Amendment tiumph at the Supreme Court four years ago, to be calling the tune on judicial nominations for an entire political party. Free the Republican caucus. Follow Lisa Murkowski's lead. Recognize a naked power play for what it is. Voters who think they care about the crisis of gun violence in America are part of the problem, not the solution - they are enablers if they aren't willing to help their elected representatives cast off the N.R.A.'s chains. Call for an end to the cowardly flilibuster against Caitlin Halligan, whose nomination the president resubmitted in September. The next time a senator announces opposition to a judicial nomince, demand something other than incoherent mumbo-jumbo. Tell the senator to fill in the blank: "I oppose this nominee because $\qquad$ ." If there's an answer of substance, fine. That's advise-and-consent democracy. But if, upon inspection, the real answer is "because the N.R.A. told me to," we have a problem. Based on these last few years, I think we do.

Evil vs. crazy: What's in the minds of mass murderers?
By Martin E.P. Seligman, Published: January 3
Martin Seligman, a former president of the American Psychological Association, is a professor of psychology at the University of Pennsylvania and the author of "What You can Change and What You Can't."

Since the massacre of innocents at Sandy Hook Elementary
School[http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-srv/special/nation/newtown-school-shootingvictims/](http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-srv/special/nation/newtown-school-shootingvictims/), calls have rung out for improving "mental health services." This deflects from actions that would save lives. Such calls blur the distinction - and I now dispense with the euphemisms - between what is crazy and what is evil. Further, they compound our national reluctance to face facts about what can and cannot be changed.

In modern scientific parlance, the label "crazy" centers on delusions, hallucinations and bizarre beliefs. More commonly used technical terms are "insane," "psychotic" or "schizophrenic." While less precise, crazy is no more or less pejorative than the scientific terms.
"Evil" is at least as ancient a concept as crazy. Its hallmark is a narrow moral circle in which other people are objects of moral indifference or hatred, people deemed not to deserve to live. In this usage, the label evil is not mysterious nor derived from a belief in "the devil." Rather, it is clarifying; it denotes people inclined to be violent and to put many other people at risk.

We know evil when we see it: "mean," "violent," "full of hate," "selfish," "grandiose," "without a conscience" and "bullying" all signal evil. Whatever mental illness he may have had, Adam Lanza<http://www.washingtonpost.com/local/crime/adam-lanza-is-recalled-as-a-rambunctious-kid-with-family-problems/2012/12/14/795adofe-4641-11e2-8e70-
el993528222d_story.html> died and, most likely, lived at the extreme end of evil.
Unlike the classifying and unpacking of craziness, modern science has shied away from unpacking and classifying evil. The two are separable: One can be crazy, evil, neither or both.

Plenty of people are both. Crazy people commit somewhat more violent crimes per capita than non-crazy people, but most crazy people are not evil. John Nash, the Nobel Prizewinning mathematician, was certifiably crazy for much of his life: He had an imaginary roommate and pervasive paranoid delusions. But he remained kind and compassionate. His moral circle was broad and undiminished.

Lanza's alleged autism or Asperger's syndrome does not explain what happened at Sandy Hook. Focusing on his "crazy" part will not help prevent future tragedies; the craziness
of evil people almost never comes close to explaining their crimes. Would Lanza have murdered had he not been full of hate, had he not had a very narrow moral circle? You simply do not shoot 6 -year-olds repeatedly unless you are exploding with rage and regard the violent suffering of young children and their parents with indifference or worse.

What our nation really cares about is not what label to pin on Lanza but how to prevent such incidents. To do this, we must face the facts about the possibility of changing what is crazy and changing what is evil.

I have spent most of my life working with mental illness. I have been president of the world's largest association of mental-illness workers, and $I$ am all for more funding for mental-health care and research - but not in the vain hope that it will curb violence.

While revising five editions of my textbook on abnormal psychology, I have found that drugs and therapy offer disappointingly little additional help for the mentally ill than they did 25 years ago - despite billions of dollars in funding. And there is zero promise that any developments I am aware of will help curb the violence that mentally ill persons commit.

As for progress on restraining or rehabilitating evil people, the past record and future promise are even more dismal. I know of no development that has much reduced recidivism or violence or done more to identify violent offenders in advance than was in place a generation ago.

I conclude from all this that progress in reducing violence through either helping the mentally ill or curbing the impulses of violent, non-crazy people will be very slow in coming, perhaps even fruitless. That is not where the leverage is.

Crazy people and evil people can commit mass murder, and they always do it with guns. Our society's only real leverage, at least in the near term, lies in reducing access to guns. Our national experience with another lethal menace, cigarettes, shows that government regulation massively saves lives. High taxation on cigarettes and restricting access to them has markedly cut smoking rates and improved health. High taxes on guns and strong restrictions on their availability are the only realistic hope for avoiding many more Sandy Hooks.

GILLIBRAND, SCHUMER URGE OBAMA ADMINISTRATION'S "TASK FORCE TO PREVENT GUN VIOLENCE" TO INCLUDE ANTI-GUN TRAFFICKING AND ENHANCED-BACKGROUND CHECK LEGISLATION IN FINAL RECOMMENDATIONS DUE THIS MONTH

VP Biden Leading New Interagency Task Force to Reduce Gun Violence, In Response to Tragedy at Sandy Hook Elementary School - President Obama to Act Quickly on Recommendations set To Be Completed by End of January

Gun Trafficking Prevention Act Aims to Eliminate Steady Flow of Illegal Guns into New York - $85 \%$ of the Guns Used in Crimes in NYC Come From Out-of-State, Approximately $90 \%$ of These Guns Are Illegal, Including Those Used In Attack On NYPD This Week

Fix Gun Checks Act Will Strengthen Gun Background Checks by Requiring States to Add Records on Felons and the Mentally Ill to a National Instant Criminal Background Check System - Both Measures Would Provide Tools to Investigate and Prosecute Gun Traffickers, While Protecting Law-Abiding Gun Owners

New York, NY - U.S. Senators Kirsten Gillibrand and Charles E. Schumer today urged Vice President Joseph Biden to include two important measures in his task force's final recommendations to combat gun violence, set to be released this month - a measure to prevent scores of illegal guns from being trafficked into New York, and a measure to make it harder for felons and the mentally ill from purchasing guns. V.P. Biden is leading the Obama administration's efforts examining ways to reduce gun violence, in response to the tragic shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School that killed 20 children and six adults.

The first is a federal measure, authored by Gillibrand and cosponsored by Schumer, aimed to stop the flow of illegal guns into New York and communities across the nation. Illegal guns are devastating New York communities; 85 percent of the firearms used in gun crimes in New York City come from out of state, and 90 percent of these guns are estimated to be illegal. The Gun Trafficking Prevention Act of 2013 would empower local, state, and federal law enforcement to investigate and prosecute gun traffickers and their entire criminal networks, while protecting responsible, law-abiding gun owners.

Currently, there is no federal law that defines gun trafficking in this country. While local law enforcement agencies work to track down illegal weapons, federal law still restricts localities' ability to investigate and prosecute those who traffic these firearms. Gillibrand and schumer are also supporters of common-sense measures to reduce gun violence, including closing the gun show loophole, eliminating access to high-capacity ammunition clips made for our military, and banning military-style assault weapons that have no recreational sports use.

Gillibrand and Schumer also urged Vice President Biden to move forward with the Fix Gun Checks Act which aims to combat the nation's broken gun background check system. The legislation includes a two-step process. First, the bill would require states and the federal government to send all necessary records on felons, drug abusers, the seriously mentally ill and other dangerous people to the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS), the FBI-run system for background checks on gun buyers. This step will
close various loopholes to ensure that more names of people who are federally prohibited from having guns are included in the NICS. Second, the bill requires that every gun buyer, with reasonable exceptions, must pass an instant background check. Currently, licensed dealers are required to conduct checks under the existing Brady Law. Penalties for noncompliance will be the same as those under the current Brady Law - up to a year in jail for any knowing violation of the law.
"Congress has ducked a serious national debate over common-sense gun laws for too long. We have an obligation to act and prevent tomorrow's senseless deaths by coming together and ensuring that guns stay out of the hands of criminals and the dangerously mentally ill," said Senator Gillibrand. "By cracking down on illegal gun traffickers and their vast criminal networks, we can reduce gun violence and keep our children and families safe. As a mother and a lawmaker, I will not allow these tragedies and gun violence-related deaths, to go unanswered. It is time to demand real solutions and give law enforcement the tools they need to eliminate illegal guns from the street and keep guns out of the hands of dangerous people."
"As we saw vividly on Thursday night when three New York City police officers were shot, illegal guns imported from outside our city continue to cause destruction," said senator Schumer. "We have to make sure that the mentally handicapped and violent criminals are not able to purchase weapons, and that those who traffic in illegal weapons are tracked down, caught, and punished."

The Gun Trafficking Prevention Act will:
Focus on Entire Criminal Network
First, the Gun Trafficking Prevention Act makes it illegal to traffic or assist in the trafficking of a firearm, making it unlawful to deliver or receive two or more firearms where the individual knows or has reason to believe that the firearms are being, or will be, used in a felony. By going after straw-purchasers who buy a gun for someone else to help them evade required recordkeeping and background checks, corrupt gun dealers who sell firearms to traffickers, and persons who conspire with and organize gun trafficking rings, this legislation addresses firearms trafficking at every point of the chain.

Tough Penalties for Criminals
Second, the legislation establishes stiff penalties that are a much-needed deterrent to gun trafficking. Under this bill, traffickers could face up to twenty years in prison and be fined a significant sum of money. It also provides greater penalties for kingpins who organize gun trafficking rings, subjecting them to an additional sentence of potentially five consecutive years in prison. Penalties could increase depending on the number of guns trafficked.

The bill also treats individuals engaged in a conspiracy to traffic guns the same as those who actually traffic a gun. Individuals who engage in the conspiracy are subject to the same punishment as those who physically sell and receive the illegal guns.

By creating more options and providing flexibility for prosecutors and judges, we increase the tools that are available for prosecutors in the federal criminal justice system to appropriately crack down on individuals who are engaged in every aspect of gun trafficking.

Crackdown on Corrupt Gun Dealers
Third, the Attorney General of the United States and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) are empowered to impose heightened restrictions, levy tough financial penalties, and suspend or revoke the license of any corrupt gun dealer. Corrupt gun dealers will be subject to a license suspension of up to six months and a fine of up to $\$ 2,500$ per violation. This is the first time that the levying of civil penalties will be widely available as a deterrent for corrupt gun dealers.

The Attorney General is given the authority to identify and impose special restrictions on high-risk gun dealers, which could include dealers who have been unable to trace guns as required by federal law or who report significant or frequent inventory losses or thefts, among other criteria.

To prevent these high-risk dealers from supplying guns to traffickers, federal law enforcement would be able to impose conditions on them such as increased inspections, inventory checks and reconciliation, training dealers and employees in how to avoid illegal sales, and requiring that the dealer not complete firearm sales until the national instant background check system informs the dealer that they may proceed with the sale.

The overwhelming majority of licensed gun dealers are responsible and law abiding. This bill goes after the very small minority of dealers who are contributing to the cycle of violence that puts our children and families at risk.

For those dealers that are suspected of corrupt practices, the legislation protects the right of due process before their licenses are revoked by the Attorney General, and also allows for gun dealers whose licenses have been revoked to seek judicial review. By putting reasonable punishments in place, this legislation would put corrupt gun dealers out of business, create deterrents to engaging in these behaviors and keep our neighborhoods safe from gun violence.

Resources for ATF
The fourth part of the bill provides ATF with the resources that it desperately needs to inspect all federally licensed gun dealers and further investigate high-risk gun dealers. Federal law currently allows ATF to conduct annual inspections of all federally licensed dealers, but with the current lack of resources and funding it would take the bureau between seven and ten years to properly inspect every licensed dealer in the country. This allows corrupt dealers to go for many years without being suspected or caught. To address this problem, the bill would authorize the Director of ATF to hire additional personnel to reduce the average inspection rate of gun dealers to three years.

Protections for Responsible, Law-Abiding Gun Owners
Finally, the legislation upholds the Constitution and protects the rights of law-abiding gun owners. Specifically, the bill provides a defense for an individual seller who obtains a background check on the person to whom he or she is selling prior to the sale. This serves to protect individual gun owners who make a good faith effort to ensure that they are not selling their firearm to a person who is prohibited from possessing those guns. This bill does not provide any new regulations on individuals who wish to sell or give their firearms as a gift to law-abiding family members, friends, or neighbors. It creates an incentive to conduct a background check before the gun is exchanged. It also exempts executors from prosecution under this legislation if they are carrying out the provisions of a will.

The Fix Gun Checks Act will:
Get all the Names of Prohibited Purchasers into the Background Check System
This section of bill will close various loopholes to ensure that more names of people who are federally prohibited from having guns are included in NICS.
$\varnothing$ State reporting: The bipartisan NICS Improvement Amendments Act of 2008 (Public Law 110-180) established penalties for states not in compliance with reporting requirements for persons federally prohibited from possessing firearms. The Fix Gun Checks Act of 2012 shortens the deadlines for this compliance, and limits the authority of the Attorney General to waive such penalties in future years. This bill does not establish any new penalties on the states.
$\varnothing$ Federal reporting: The bill requires every federal agency to certify to the Attorney General twice a year that all relevant records have been submitted to NICS.
$\varnothing$ Federal court reporting: The bill clarifies that federal courts must report to NICS the names of people sent to diversionary programs who qualify as prohibited gun purchasers.
$\varnothing$ Clarifies the definition of "adjudicated mentally ill": The bill clarifies that people who are ordered by a court to get outpatient treatment for mental illness are prohibited from having guns.

Require Background Checks for All Firearm Sales
This section of the bill requires background checks for the sale or transfer of all
firearms by private sellers..
$\emptyset$ Background check requirement: Requires background checks for sale or transfer of all firearms from one private party (i.e. a person who is not federally licensed) to another. Private sellers would need to visit a licensed firearms dealer to run the necessary background check before the gun sale is finalized. People who possess qualifying gun permits may display their permits in lieu of a background check. Sellers in very rural areas will be exempt from the bill.
$\emptyset$ Establishes exceptions: Establishes reasonable exceptions that would exempt certain gun transfers from background check requirements, including temporarily loaning firearms during hunting and sporting events, providing firearms as gifts to immediate family members, transferring a firearm as part of an inheritance, or temporarily transferring a firearm for immediate self-defense.
$\varnothing$ Penalties for noncompliance: Applies the same penalties for violations that apply to licensed dealers who violate the current Brady Law - up to a year in jail for any knowing violation of the law.

Dear Mr. Vice President,
Thank you for your leadership in developing a critically important and necessary plan to address the problem of gun violence in America. In the wake of the shootings in Newtown, Connecticut, which took the lives of 20 precious children and 6 brave adults, we agree that we must work together to finally put an end to this type of senseless violence.

Gun violence became very personal to us when our friend and colleague, Rep. Gabby Giffords, was nearly killed at the hands of a mentally ill gunman while conducting the same type of constituent-greeting event we have done dozens of times in our own careers. Moreover, in our home state of New York, we have seen too many parents' lives shattered, including the parents of slain 17-year old Nyasia Pryear-Yard, a straight-A student on the verge of attending college before being gunned down in Brooklyn, New York. As parents ourselves, the tragedy at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown hit extremely close to home.

As you move forward on developing recommendations with the newly formed Interagency Task Force to Reduce Gun Violence, we urge you to consider both the role that illegal guns play in gun crimes committed across America and the failures of the current federal background check system in preventing illegal gun sales. Every day, illegal guns flow into cities around the country. In New York City, $85 \%$ of the guns used in gun crimes come from out of state, and $90 \%$ of these guns are estimated to be illegal. Yet while local law enforcement agencies work overtime to track down these weapons, federal law still restricts their ability to investigate and prosecute those who traffic these firearms. The absence of any federal law defining gun trafficking in this country is shocking. We have thousands of laws, but effectively none of them are directly focused on preventing someone in Virginia from driving to New York City to sell a cache of guns.
We are also deeply troubled that approximately $40 \%$ of guns, many of which are later trafficked, are purchased through the "Gun Show Loophole," by which the buyer can avoid submitting to a background check. While the majority of Americans believe that law-
abiding Americans have a constitutional right to buy a gun, they also believe that each of these citizens should undergo a background check. As you know, these checks are completed in seconds and do not prevent the legal sale of guns. However, effective checks would stop mentally ill, felons, and other prohibited persons from buying guns and potentially using these guns to harm other Americans. It is our goal in the next Congress to move forward on the Gun Trafficking Prevention Act and the Fix Gun Checks Act that we have each respectively authored while working closely with Rep. Carolyn McCarthy, New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg, New York City Police Commissioner Raymond Kelly, and the Brady Campaign to Prevent Gun Violence. These are common sense pieces of legislation that allow all levels of law enforcement agencies to investigate and prosecute the illegal sale of guns, while protecting the rights of responsible, law-abiding gun owners.
Mr. Vice President, we stand firmly with President Obama's call to action for a comprehensive approach that refuses to accept gun violence as routine. As you convene this task force, we ask that you make gun trafficking and strengthened background checks an important part of your discussion. We have introduced bills that will help reduce gun violence and we are ready and willing to work with this task force to stem the flow of illegal guns into our communities.

## Giffords and Kelly: Fighting gun violence

## Our new campaign will launch a national dialogue and raise funds to counter influence of the gun lobby.

In response to a horrific series of shootings that has sown terror in our communities, victimized tens of thousands of Americans, and left one of its own bleeding and near death in a Tucson parking lot, Congress has done something quite extraordinary - nothing at all.

I was shot in the head while meeting with constituents two years ago today. Since then, my extensive rehabilitation has brought excitement and gratitude to our family. But time and time again, our joy has been diminished by new, all too familiar images of death on television: the breaking news alert, stunned witnesses blinking away tears over unspeakable carnage, another community in mourning. America has seen an astounding 11 mass shootings since a madman used a semiautomatic pistol with an extended ammunition clip to shoot me and kill six others. Gun violence kills more than 30,000 Americans annually.

This country is known for using its determination and ingenuity to solve problems, big and small. Wise policy has conquered disease, protected us from dangerous products and substances, and made transportation safer. But when it comes to protecting our communities from gun violence, we're not even trying - and for the worst of reasons.

## An ideological fringe

Special interests purporting to represent gun owners but really advancing the interests of an ideological fringe have used big money and influence to cow Congress into submission. Rather than working to find the balance between our rights and the regulation of a dangerous product, these groups have cast simple protections for our communities as existential threats to individual liberties. Rather than conducting a dialogue, they threaten those who divert from their orthodoxy with political extinction.

As a result, we are more vulnerable to gun violence. Weapons designed for the battlefield have a home in our streets. Criminals and the mentally ill can easily purchase guns by avoiding background checks. Firearm accessories designed for killing at a high rate are legal and widely available. And gun owners are less responsible for the misuse of their weapons than they are for their automobiles.

Forget the boogeyman of big, bad government coming to dispossess you of your firearms. As a Western woman and a Persian Gulf War combat veteran who have exercised our Second Amendment rights, we don't want to take away your guns any more than we want to give up the two guns we have locked in a safe at home. What we do want is what the majority of NRA members and other Americans want: responsible changes in our laws to require responsible gun ownership and reduce gun violence.

We saw from the NRA leadership's defiant and unsympathetic response to the Newtown, Conn., massacre that winning even the most common-sense reforms will require a fight. But whether it has been in campaigns or in Congress, in combat or in space, fighting for what we believe in has always been what we do.

## Let's not be naive

We can't be naive about what it will take to achieve the most common-sense solutions. We can't just hope that the last shooting tragedy will prevent the next. Achieving reforms to reduce gun violence and prevent mass shootings will mean matching gun lobbyists in their reach and resources.

Americans for Responsible Solutions, which we are launching today, will invite people from around the country to join a national conversation about gun violence prevention, will raise the funds necessary to balance the influence of the gun lobby, and will line up squarely behind leaders who will stand up for what's right.

Until now, the gun lobby's political contributions, advertising and lobbying have dwarfed spending from antigun violence groups. No longer. With Americans for Responsible Solutions engaging millions of people about ways to reduce gun violence and funding political activity nationwide, legislators will no longer have reason to fear the gun lobby. Other efforts such as improving mental health care and opposing illegal guns are essential, but as gun owners and survivors of gun violence, we have a unique message for Americans.

We have experienced too much death and hurt to remain idle. Our response to the Newtown massacre must consist of more than regret, sorrow and condolence. The children of Sandy Hook Elementary School and all
victims of gun violence deserve fellow citizens and leaders who have the will to prevent gun violence in the future.

## Richard Socarides' Glass House

Every now and again, you get whiplash. Here is Bill Clinton's former chief liaison with the gay community demanding that Chuck Hagel account more fully for his past statements and actions on gay people. Let me repeat: Bill Clinton's "principal adviser to Clinton on gay and lesbian civil rights issues" from 1993 to 1999. Think about that for a minute.
Socarides was paid to defend the Defense of Marriage Act in public and certainly didn't quit over its passage, as any gay person with true commitment to gay equality would have. In this respect, I think of him as the opposite of Bob Hattoy, an old dead friend who, like Socarides, worked for the Clinton machine, but, unlike Socarides, didn't put his gay soul on eBay to do so. Dee-Dee Myers said of Bob:
He wasn't wrong, but he wasn't necessarily helpful to the administration cause.... He had one foot inside and one foot outside.

Which brings me to Socarides. He had both feet firmly inside the administration's cause and did all he could to back the Clintons against the real lives of gay people.

Recall: he was paid to spin the Don't Ask Don't Tell policy, even as it doubled the discharges of gay servicemembers in the military under Clinton's term. He was paid by an administration that made every effort to kill the marriage movement (believe me, I was there and saw it up-close), a movement in which Socarides was AWOL until the political tide safely turned. With Socarides as chief adviser, Bill Clinton also signed the law that made me and countless other non-Americans with HIV forbidden to enter the US and live under a brutal legal surveillance system which Clinton did nothing to change. Clinton even broke a clear campaign promise not to codify and sign the measure into law. How does a gay person work for someone who signs such a bill, stigmatizing countless people with HIV and putting the US on the same level as Saudi Arabia? And when will Socarides apologize to me and countless others for being there and not stopping it and not resigning?
In fact, I recall no moment in his career in which Socarides apologized for selling out
the gay community in every single possible way in order to stay comfortably ensconced in the Clinton White House. And notice the gay issues Socarides focuses on:
[Hagel's] record earned him a zero-per-cent rating (three times) from the Human Rights Campaign, the leading gay-rights lobby. Among other things, Hagel voted against extending basic employment nondiscrimination protections and the federal hate-crimes law to cover gay Americans.

If you read Virtually Normal, you will find that I too opposed such initiatives because they ducked the core issue of how government treats its gay citizens, which, in my view, should come before the same government regulates the actions of its own citizens. And because hate crimes are a bullshit legal category. Would I be deemed by a Clinton-hack as insufficiently in favor of gay rights - back when Socarides was advising a president who was eviscerating them? The truth is: I would have been and was at the time. Because I was a limited government conservative - not because I was anti-gay at all.
Socarides summarizes with this statement:
Hagel will have to show not only some genuine regret for his past actions and statements about gay Americans but also a real command of the civil-rights issues facing the military in order to convince people of that.

Here's a better idea: let's have Richard Socarides not only show some genuine regret for his working for a president who signed more anti-gay laws than any other in American history - but also offer proof that he has evolved from enabling attacks on gay Americans to backing their rights. Let's get that apology now, so that he and Hagel are on equal ground.

## Grand Rapids Mayor George Heartwell to launch Coalition for Gun Control

GRAND RAPIDS, MI - Frustrated by his city's inability to ban firearms from public meetings, Mayor George Heartwell plans to start a Coalition for Gun Control that would aim to put such a prohibition in state law.

The announcement came during a Tuesday, Jan. 8, Grand Rapids City Commission meeting at which several people were armed in support of a proposal to amend an unenforced local firearms ordinance that prohibits open-carrying of guns. In a prepared statement, Heartwell called firearms in public meetings "abhorrent" and urged Grand Rapids residents to lobby state lawmakers for "rational gun control measures."
"Gun laws in our state and nation need to be changed," he said. "We simply must have reasonable gun control.
"We must keep guns out of the hands of criminals and sociopaths. We must ban assault-type military weapons for civilian possession. And we must keep guns out of public buildings including voting stations."

## Grand Rapids has no plans to change unenforced gun ordinance

Heartwell lost his temper during the meeting at which a Michigan Open Carry, Inc. member proposed an amendment to the city's firearms ordinance. City commissioners said they're not interested in updating the antiquated local code to conform with state law.

Heartwell spoke and blogged about gun control in the wake of Newtown, Conn. shootings in December. He also chastised men who showed up to a Dec. 18 City Commission meeting with guns on their hips.
"Guns in public meetings knot my stomach because they function to suppress free speech," he said Tuesday. "In the heat of a public debate on a contentious issue, guns have a chilling effect on citizens
"We need at the local level to be able to say no to that."

## Gun violence prevention forum in Vallejo draws large crowd, varied opinions

Emotions ran deep and opinions wide Wednesday night at a packed gun violence prevention forum at Vallejo City Hall. Many speakers supported gun ownership while others called for greater measures to prevent senseless shootings.

Sponsored by Rep. Mike Thompson, D-St. Helena, the forum came in the wake of last month's school shooting tragedy in Connecticut. The meeting drew social service experts, school officials, Vallejo's police chief and state Department of Justice representatives.
"I hope to hear from folks on how to stem gun violence," said Thompson, who chair the newly formed Congressional Gun Violence Prevention Task Force. Since last week Thompson also has been representing Vallejo.

The task force will consider suggestions, concerns and opinions expressed at three forums, including one tonight in Santa Rosa. A Vietnam veteran and avid hunter, Thompson said the panel will try to find ways to stem and prevent gun violence.
"The terrible tragedy in
Connecticut has motivated the American people" to demand that government take actions to stem gunrelated violence, Thompson said. He was referring to the mass shooting at the Sandy Hook School which resulted in the deaths of 27 elementary school children and teachers.

Some speakers focused on the Second Amendment's right to bear arms, the need for stronger families, and more religious
education in schools.

Thompson stressed that he supports the Second Amendment, is a gun owner himself and supports lawabiding, mentally stable individuals owning such weaponry.

Better mental health provisions, background checks and controls on where and how guns are sold must be studied and enacted, however, Thompson said.

Other speakers blamed a violence-laden culture in which shootings and deaths are common in videos, movies and TV shows, while still others called for improvements in mental health services.

Nearly 60 speakers had signed up to voice concerns, and dozens were waiting to make their views heard at press deadline.

Throughout the forum, sisters of Vallejoan Mario Romero, 23, who was shot and killed by Vallejo police on Sept. 2, decried what they believed to be irresponsible gun use by police officers.
"If you want to stop gun violence make sure those who are charged to protect us don't prey on us," one sister said.

Before the forum's public portion, Mayor Osby Davis read a joint statement he and Benicia Mayor Elizabeth Patterson co-authored. In it, he said both cities would hold a gun buyback program next month with other cities and areas.
"We certainly agree that there are too many guns on the streets," Davis said. "The proliferation of guns in our society in general and automatic assault weapons in particular have created an unsafe and dangerous environment in general as well as families and our youth.
"It is time to put politics aside, use practical common sense and balance the safety of society, our families and our children with the right to own guns," he said.

Vallejo Police Chief Joseph Kreins said guns and shootings have become a crisis in the city, citing statistics of weekend shootings and shots fired calls which officers respond to continuously.

Kreins said some gun-related items need better controls to keep them from the general public, such as armor-piercing ammunition. He also suggested improved firearm registries, waiting periods and mental health evaluations for those who buy guns.

Benicia Unified School District Superintendent Janice Adams said continuous cuts have led to reductions in the number of school resource officers to promote safety and security.

Vallejo resident Tranquilino Martinez said gun violence has to stop. "Stop the insanity. Stop making guns of mass destruction and stop making them available."

By contrast, Thomas Powell of Powell Brothers Feed \& Pet in Vallejo said guns in the hands of teachers and others could prevent killings and also serve as a deterrent to some shooters.

Pastor Charles Brown of St. Mark Community Church in Vallejo said fostering spiritual health and instilling in young people the value of life is paramount.

## Gun violence forum in Napa becomes tense <br> Tuesday, January 08, 2013

NAPA, Calif. (KGO) -- Passions ran high Tuesday night during the first of several gun violence forums in the Bay Area. These meetings were triggered by the elementary school shootings in Connecticut and hundreds of people with differing opinions on gun rights filled Napa City Hall.
After more than two hours, the event wrapped up Tuesday night. The event was built as a chance to let a local congressman to hear from citizens about ways to stop gun violence, but also to deal with issues with mental health programs and violence in the entertainment industry.
The evening featured passionate give and take on the subject of gun control and gun rights.
"For you to sit there and try to limit and encourage people to limit our Constitution is just appalling," said Napa resident Kevin Goza.
At times, the man getting the backlash was Rep. Mike Thompson, D-St. Helena, who was just appointed by House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi, D-California, to lead a gun violence prevention task force. It follows the mass shooting of 20 elementary school children and seven adults last month in Newtown, Connecticut. Thompson wants to ban the type of semi-automatic rifle used in that attack.
"As a gun owner and hunter, I don't think they do us any good. I think it's a cloud over our heads and I don't think they should be in our communities and I don't think they should be on our streets," said Thompson.
The overflow crowd of about 200 spilled down the hallway of Napa City Hall. They heard a few speakers repeat the NRA's call to have armed guards in all schools.
"Those kids might have been alive if a few of the office personnel or some of the people had a concealed carry permit to protect our children," said Napa resident Paul Warnock.
That idea did not go unchallenged.
"And I know I'm going to get booed, but when I listen to the leadership of the NRA saying we need more guns in the schools, I could vomit," said American Canyon resident Joan Bennett. Speakers called for better mental health programs and blamed a reliance on pharmaceuticals.
"It seems like now society is throwing pills to these young men like Tic Tacs," said Napa resident Mike Desimoni.
And media coverage of shootings also took a hit.
"...because of them it makes shooting of a school library, a post office, something glorified," said Napa resident Jordan Jinks.
Thompson will hold a similar forum on Wednesday in Vallejo and on Thursday in Santa Rosa. He'll then take his ideas back to Washington for possible legislation.

Discussions of federal legislation on gun control have proven to be a spark for contentious debate in America, and Tuesday night's forum at the Napa City Hall was no exception. Residents packed into the City Council chambers to voice opinions on both sides of the debate to a panel featuring U.S. Rep. Mike Thompson, D-St. Helena, and officials representing local law enforcement agencies, school systems, and mental health service providers. The forum's intent was to gather a wide variety of view points that may help shape legislation that will be advanced by a task force Thompson is chairing in Congress.
It certainly provided those view points, as 55 people had signed up to speak, and the forum ran over its allotted time of an hour and a half.
Thompson started the event by saying that ideas expressed at local community forums often help craft policies intended to tackle the complex issues that are at root of mass shootings, including the one at an elementary school in Connecticut in December.
"It's not going to be fixed by one law," Thompson said. "It has to do with a culture of violence.
Often the best ideas about how to combat these things have come from the community."
The task force is made up of Democrats in the House of Representatives, and will be examining a number of potential policies, which include:

- curbing access to military-type weapons and high-capacity ammunition clips;
- coordinating with schools and mental health professionals to develop the best means of preventing gun violence and mass shootings;
- stopping glorification of gun violence from permeating throughout the media and entertainment industries.
John Staggs, a firearm instructor in Napa, said the notion of banning military-type weapons and high capacity magazines is misguided, and wouldn't keep mentally ill people from seeking to kill other people.
"It's not the guns that kill people," Staggs said. "A magazine has never killed anybody either. If you're mentally ill and you're going to kill somebody, you're going to kill somebody."

Joan Bennett, an American Canyon city councilmember, said she has never owned a gun, but acknowledged how emotional discussing guns can be among Americans. She said she was sickened by the comments made by National Rifle Association leader Wayne LaPierre after the shooting in Newtown, Conn., that armed guards are need to protect schools.
"To me, that is not safety in our community," Bennett said.
Napa resident Ed Estin said he used to work as a probation officer in southern Los Angeles, but never carried a firearm while working. He said there is no need for assault weapons, and called upon the task force to work to improve mental health care in the U.S. He said the actions of former President Ronald Reagan left the mentally ill "on the streets - and they remain on the streets."
"Would I feel more safe knowing there's guns here in this room?" Estin asked the audience. "No. It's time that we stop letting the bully pulpit rule."
Margie Mohler, a member of the Yountville Town Council, said the violence is spawned by the way media coverage treats violent events.
"This is a copy-cat effect," Mohler said. "It's really been a tragic flaw of our information age." Napa resident Jordan Jinx also said media coverage was to blame.
"Because of them, it makes the shooting of a school, a library, a post office, something glorified," Jinx said.
Bill Chadwick, who identified himself as a former member of a special forces unit in the military, said he is an avid hunter. But he fails to see any need for assault weapons or highcapacity clips.
"Unless you arm the game we're hunting there's no need for high-capacity magazines," Chadwick said.

(CNN) - A congressman took the renewed gun debate from Capitol Hill to his constituents in California, holding a town hall Tuesday night on gun control nearly a month after a gunman massacred 27 people in Newtown, Connecticut before shooting himself.

Democratic Rep. Mike Thompson, tapped by House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi to explore proposals for new firearm regulations, met with residents in Napa for a passion-filled debate on how best to curb gun violence.
"I'm a sportsman, I'm a gun owner, and I think our failure to come together and to deal with this is going to reflect poorly on the future of sports men and women gun owners," Thompson, a wounded Vietnam veteran, told the audience. "I think we can in fact make some good of this."

The town hall is one of many high profile conversations taking place this week. Vice President Joe

Biden is holding meetings-including a sit-down with the National Rifle Association-at the White House to find similar recommendations. Former Rep. Gabrielle Giffords, who was shot in the head two years ago this week, and her husband Mark Kelly launched a website Tuesday aimed at finding solutions.

And CNN's Piers Morgan held a now-viral interview Monday with Alex Jones, a radio host who unleashed fury over what he describes as threatening attacks against the Second Amendment.

Speaking at the town hall Tuesday, Thompson said he supports banning the same type of assault weapon used in the Connecticut shooting, as well as the movie theater rampage in Aurora, Colorado earlier this year.
"As a gun owner and a hunter, I don't think they do us any good. I think it's a cloud over our heads. And I don't think that they should be in our communities, and I don't think that they should be in our streets," he said.
"The fact of matter is that there is too much violence," he continued. "There has been over 800 people killed because of gun violence since the tragedy in Connecticut, and we really need to do something about it."

Tuesday's town hall was the first of three this week. Thompson will meet with residents in Vallejo on Wednesday and Santa Rosa on Thursday.

In addition to regulations, Thompson's task force is looking into other issues, such as mental health and the proliferation of violence in entertainment and media. "It's extremely complicated, and there are a lot of moving pieces."

But some residents-gathered in a standing-room-only crowd at Napa City Hall-argued that any type of movement against gun ownership could be a slippery slope towards the elimination of all guns.
"It's not the guns that kill people. It's the people that kill people, and it's the mentally ill that kill people," said John Staggs, a certified NRA instructor. "You said that (800) people died from handguns?...Well 63 million people, legal gun owners, didn't kill anybody today."

He also took issue with proposals to prevent the purchase of large capacity magazines, devices that hold more than 10 rounds of ammunition.
"A magazine has never killed anyone either and you can say, well we're gonna put ten rounds in a magazine," Staggs said. "That's wonderful, sure. You tape two together, turn it upside down and have 20 rounds. It doesn't matter how many rounds you have. If you're mentally ill and gonna kill somebody, you're gonna kill somebody."

Another individual argued that places with strict gun bans tend to have more gun violence, raising Chicago as an example.
"I don't think banning guns is the way to approach helping our kids and keeping us safe," the individual said.

Some gun rights supporters reiterated the NRA proposal to equip every school in the country with an armed guard, a recommendation announced one week after last month's elementary school shooting.
Though tensions got high at points, the debate never erupted into over-the-top dueling, as members of
the audience cheered and clapped almost equally at both sides of the argument.
One woman, who works with mentally impaired adults, called for gun permits to be re-evaluated like drivers licenses, saying people "change throughout their lives."
"Disease and emotional stress often impair a person's judgment and cognition," said a woman who identified herself as Linda. "In crisis many people turn their guns on others despite no documented history of mental illness."

Another woman, who identified herself as "just a regular person in life," seemed to cringe at the thought of providing more public places with guns.
"I want to be able to look at life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, and to me that does not mean a gun in every school. A gun in every studio. A gun in every theater. A gun everywhere. To me, that is not safety in our community," she said, adding that when she listens to the NRA's proposal for school safety, she feels she "could vomit."

Gov. John Hickenlooper's call for "universal" background checks on gun sales is a prudent move, but it hardly constitutes a bold agenda for a state that has seen more than its fair share of shooting tragedies. It was hard not to draw comparisons between Hickenlooper's State of the State address Thursday and the fiery speech given Wednesday by New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo in which he called for state bans on assault weapons and large-capacity magazines. Two Democrats. Two different takes.
We're not suggesting one size fits all in gun control policy, or that what is good for New York is good for Colorado, but we had hoped for something more far-reaching than requiring that those who buy guns in private sales be required to undergo background checks.
That's not a knock on the measure being crafted by state Rep. Rhonda Fields, D-Aurora. The measure would close a loophole in state law, which requires background checks for guns purchased at gun shows and retail establishments, but not private transactions. It's a good idea.
But what about the other bill that Fields, whose son was murdered by a gunman in 2005, is working on? A Denver Post story said Fields is putting together legislation that would ban large-capacity magazines that enable a shooter to modify a gun to fire many bullets in a short time-frame. It would have been good to see Hickenlooper stick his neck out and take a position on that idea.
Hickenlooper's take on ways to prevent violence includes a call to change the state's standards for committing people with mental problems to make it easier to get them help. His proposal would bolster funding for the mental health care system by \(\$ 18.5\) million. Laudable ideas, to be sure.
The governor's third State of the State address included support for civil unions, and a Colorado version of the DREAM Act, which would allow illegal immigrant children who've grown up in Colorado to pay tuition that is closer to the in-state rate than the pricey out-of-state rate.
With both chambers of the legislature controlled by Democrats, it's all but a lock those measures will pass, and the state will be better for them.
Taken cumulatively, Hickenlooper's address was a reserved exercise that touched upon business and energy themes that appeal to Republicans and other issues and causes that have been supported by his fellow Democrats for some years.
As such, he could have taken a bolder stance on gun control while maintaining his reputation as pragmatist.

We've been through a series of conversations with Trevor, Julie and Karen.
Here's an overview of what the concert would look like:
-- Three hours of music broken up by speakers throughout ( 15 minutes per hour).
-- Venue is Hammerstein Ballroom which is being donated.
-- Michael Stipe is creative director and Steve Jordan would produce, who has deep background in concerts.
-- We could consider a host like Chris Rock.
-- Musical performances believed highly likely (according to Julie P.) include Pearl Jam, Dave Matthews, Nora Jones, Wilco, Bono, Lumineers, Lady Gaga, John Legend, Mos Def, Tim McGraw, Fiona Apple, MGMT, Kanye and others.

Co-chair Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg also released "Access Denied", a new report that
surveys all the efforts by the gun lobby, with the cooperation of congress, to suppress data and research funding on gun violence, making it difficult to study the causes of gun violence and to hold the firearms industry accountable for their role in the epidemic. The report (available here<http://www. demandaplan.org/blog/2013-01-access-denied-how-the-gun-lobby-is-depriving-polices) was released at a summit focused on gun violence research at Johns Hopkins University's Bloomberg School of Public Health.
"Thirty days have passed since 20 children and six adults were gunned down at Sandy Hook Elementary School - and still, no action has been taken by Washington to end our country's gun violence epidemic," said Mayors Against Illegal Guns Co-Chair and New York City Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg. "Now is the time for Congress to buck the special interests of the gun lobby that endanger our children. This means requiring background checks for every gun sale, restricting assault weapons and high capacity magazines, and making gun trafficking a federal crime. We cannot let another month go by with no action."
"Today we remember the lives that were needlessly lost one month ago, and the 33 lives taken by gun violence across our country every day," Mayors Against Illegal Guns Co-Chair and Boston Mayor Thomas M. Menino said. "But we also continue our call for action to take the illegal guns out of our neighborhoods, and tragedies like Newtown out of our nation's future. This time must be different. Our leaders in washington must act, and pass the common-sense gun reforms necessary to protect our children and communities."

Mayors Against Illegal Guns also announced today that since the Newtown shooting, it has added more than 100 mayors to its national bipartisan coalition to end gun violence and grown to more than one million supporters.

The "Access Denied" report released today reviews how the U.S. does nearly no scientific research to understand or prevent gun violence - and blocks questions from police, military officers and even doctors to learn more. All of this despite the fact that Americans murder each other with guns at nearly 20 times the rate of residents of other high-income countries. This is because for 20 years, the National Rifle Association's Washington leadership has advanced policies to obstruct access to and analysis of information related to firearms and violence.

The report shows how the restrictions have affected many fields, including:
Science: Since 1996, CDC funding for firearm injury prevention has fallen 96 percent and is now just \(\$ 100,000\) of its \(\$ 5.6\) billion budget.

Law enforcement: The National Institute of Justice, the principal research arm of the Justice Department, funded 32 gun-related studies between 1993 and 1999, yet it has not funded a single public gun-related study during the Obama Administration.

Military leaders and doctors: In 2010, a defense funding bill prohibited commanding officers and mental health counselors from talking with severely depressed service members about the risks posed by guns in their private possession. This was done during an epidemic of suicide among active-duty service members in which suicides exceeded combat deaths in Afghanistan. The large majority of military suicides are committed with guns. (Congress repealed this gag order recently at the insistence of mayors, retired flag officers and mental health advocates.) The gun lobby has also passed state laws that prohibit doctors from discussing firearms with their patients.

The report recommends that these restrictions be lifted and particularly that congress remove "policy riders" on federal appropriations bills that limit firearms research at the CDC and NIH provide appropriate funding to study the role of firearms on public health to reduce crime and save lives. Police departments also need data to effectively fight crime. In 2006, New York City analyzed "trace data" for guns found at crime scenes to identify the dealers who sold them. The city investigated and sued 27 of those dealers, and 24 settled and were monitored by the court to improve their sales practices. As a result, the share of guns sold by those dealers that were recovered in New York City
crimes dropped by 84 percent.
The new television ad is being released at events hosted by 40 mayors and law enforcement officials across the country including Cranston, NJ; Durham-Chapel Hill, NC; Ft. Wayne, IN; Lancaster, PA; Lansing, MI; Miami, FL; Media, PA; Portland, ME; Portland, OR; Santa Fe, NM and Telluride, CO. The ad will air nationally on cable as well as in all of these markets.

In an effort to keep their communities safe, local leaders at today's events also urged Washington to end gun violence in America by:
- Requiring criminal background checks for all gun sales: Background checks are the only systematic way to stop felons, domestic abusers and other dangerous people from buying firearms. But federal law only requires background checks for gun sales at licensed dealers. Almost 6.6 million guns are sold each year in the U.S. by unlicensed "private sellers," including online and at gun shows. That means that between \(40 \%\) and \(50 \%\) of gun sales may take place with no background check for the buyer. According to Republican pollster Frank Luntz, \(82 \%\) of gun owners support criminal background checks on all gun sales.
- Banning military-style assault weapons and high-capacity magazines: Militarystyle weapons and high-capacity ammunition magazines (those with more than 10 rounds) have no place on our streets. They are designed to kill large numbers of people quickly, and they have no other use in civilian hands. Today, even people with criminal records, or with serious mental illness, can and do buy assault weapons from unlicensed private sellers who don't conduct background checks.

Make gun trafficking a federal crime: Every year, tens of thousands of guns find their way into the hands of criminals through illegal trafficking channels. But there is no clear and effective statute that makes gun trafficking a federal crime. Prosecutors who want to combat traffickers are forced to rely on a weak law that prohibits "engaging in the business of selling guns without a federal license," which carries the same punishment as trafficking chicken or livestock.

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WASHINGTON -- The head of the National Rifle Association says the organization has no problem with tighter background checks of gun purchasers.

But association president David Keene also says too much emphasis has been placed on banning certain firearms.

In an interview on "CBS This Morning" Thursday, Keene argues, quote, "The real question that needs to be addressed is not what we do about guns, but what we do to make our schools safer."

The NRA has come under close scrutiny in the wake of Newtown, Conn., shootings that killed 20 children and six adults.

Keene said officials should focus more attention on a "devastatingly broken mental health system in this country," if they genuinely want to end gun violence.

He said the NRA has been "generally supportive" of stronger background checks.

Jim Wallis, founder of the evangelical movement Sojourners, challenged the NRA Vice President Wayne LaPierre's argument that "the only thing that stops a bad guy with a gun is a good guy with a gun."
Wallis, who was among 25 clergy at a Tuesday news conference, called LaPierre's view "morally mistaken, theologically dangerous and religiously repugnant. The world is not full of good and bad people, that's not what the scripture teaches. We all have bad and good in us."
Progressive clergy have long preached for tighter gun measures but since the mass shooting at a Newtown, Conn. elementary school, their demands are getting much more specific and the clergy involved are coming from a broader base.
Monday night, a few dozen national clergy who serve now or have as official advisors to President Obama issued a statement calling for "reasonable steps" such as the enforcement of universal background checks for people buying guns and the "collection and publication of relevant" data on gun violence.
The statement is signed by leaders including the Rev. Larry Snyder, the head of the Catholic Church's social service arm; National Association of Evangelicals Leith Anderson; and mainline leaders from the Episcopal and Lutheran churches, among others.
"[We] call upon our communities and our elected officials to make every effort to save human lives, especially the lives of children, from senseless gun violence that does not represent the responsible citizenship intended by the Second Amendment," the statement reads.
More specific is the push coming from a group called Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence, which grew out of a successful clergy effort to limit use of tobacco. The group led the Tuesday news conference with Wallis and 25 others, who were among 47 heads of major groups who signed a letter calling for: criminal background checks to buy guns, the removal of guns and magazines from public streets and the making of gun trafficking a federal crime.
The signers lead groups made up of tens of millions of Americans.
The efforts are meant to press and support Vice President Biden's upcoming report on measures to stem gun violence. \(<\) http \(/ /\) www.washingtonpost.com/blogs/the-fix/wp/2013/01/15/president-obamas-fine-line-on-guns/>
The gun control campaign is a visible effort for progressive faith leaders in particular, who many religious progressives feel haven't been confrontational enough in recent years and have ceded the public debate square to religious conservatives. The question is how effective they can be at a time when Americans are moving away from institutional religion, thus lessening the clout of even major groups like the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops or the Islamic Society of North America or the National Association of Evangelicals.
There are notable absences to this effort, particularly white evangelicals, who make up a fifth of the country's population. Even young evangelicals leaders who are known for their focus on bridge-building have been quiet or hostile to the new press for gun control. Among them are writer and thought-leader Gabe Lyons, founder of the trend-setting Q Conference, who last week framed the push for gun control as "the current gun restriction debate" and evidence of another "lost liberty."
That puts Lyons squarely in the mainstream of white evangelicals, who overwhelmingly oppose stricter
gun laws (by 68 percent in an August Post poll). Otherwise faith identity and practice aren't typically good predictors of Americans' views on gun control. People who attend worship and people who don't are both essentially much split down the middle on the question of stricter laws. White Protestants, white Catholics and people with no religious affiliation are also divided. Black Protestants, like African Americans in general, favor stricter gun laws.
Clergy involved in this post-Newtown effort have been clear, however, that there is a racial gap, with some African Americans frustrated that it took Newtown to bring focus to an issue that has long afflicted black children in cities. That gap was on display at the Tuesday news conference, with an overwhelmingly white group of clergy at the microphone.
"African American clergy have been saying these things, we just haven't been with them," said Washington Episcopal Bishop Mariann Budde. "We live in such economically and racially segregated times, you don't see it until acts cross the color and economics line, and gets people's attention."

WASHINGTON (RNS) Dozens of the nation's faith leaders said Tuesday (Jan. 15) that they're ready to take on the gun lobby and demanded that politicians take quick and concrete steps to stem gun violence. Violence, \(<\) http://www.bradycampaign.org/toomanyvictims/faiths-united-to-prevent-gun-violence/> the signers said the slayings at a Newtown, Conn., elementary school last month had pushed them to redouble their efforts, and created an opportunity to beat back the gun lobby.
The Rev. Jim Wallis, the evangelical who heads the progressive Christian group Sojourners, took on Wayne LaPierre, the outspoken executive vice president of the National Rifle Association, directly. LaPierre's statement after Newtown that the "the only thing that stops a bad guy with a gun is a good guy with a gun" is "morally mistaken" and "religiously repugnant," Wallis said.
"The world is not full of good and bad people. That is not what our scriptures teach us," but that each individual is both good and bad, Wallis said.
"And when we are bad or isolated or angry or furious or vengeful or politically agitated or confused or lost or deranged or unhinged, and we have the ability to get and use weapons only designed to kill large numbers of people," Wallis continued, "our society is in great danger."
The coalition is part of a larger movement, led by President Obama and some Democratic members of Congress, to tighten gun laws in the wake of the Newtown massacre and previous mass killings by lone gunmen in Aurora, Colo., Tuscon, Ariz., and elsewhere in the past several years.
A Washington Post-ABC News poll published on Jan. 14, a month after the Newtown massacre, found that 52 percent of Americans said the horror of Newtown had made them more supportive of gun
control.
New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo signed a gun control bill Tuesday and other state legislatures are also considering stricter gun regulations.
Others who signed the letter include: Carol Blythe, president of the Alliance of Baptists; Sister Carol Keehan, president and CEO of the Catholic Health Association; Sayyid M. Syeed of the Islamic Society of North America; Rajwant Singh, chairman of the Sikh Council on Religion and Education; and Suhag Shukla, executive director of the Hindu American Foundation.
Polls show that Americans generally favor the restrictions endorsed by the coalition even if their representatives in Congress may not, said Vincent DeMarco, national coordinator of Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence.
The Rev. J. Herbert Nelson II of the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s Washington office said people of faith must reframe the debate on gun control, and support "those of us who would challenge the false choice between guns and freedom."
The NRA, the most powerful of gun owners' rights groups, argues that any new restrictions on guns threaten the Second Amendment right to bear arms.
Nelson noted that more Americans have been killed in domestic gun violence than in foreign wars, and that the coalition had decided to speak out on the birthday of Martin Luther King Jr., who would have been 84 on Tuesday.
"I am convinced if he were here today, this issue would be the priority of his leadership," Nelson said. Rachel Laser, deputy director of the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism, noted that King had deplored the proliferation of weapons in the United States before he himself was shot to death. She quoted King's words from 1963:
"By our readiness to allow arms to be purchased at will and fired at whim, by allowing our movie and television screens to teach our children that the hero is one who masters the art of shooting and the technique of killing ... we have created an atmosphere in which violence and hatred have become popular pastimes," she quoted King.
"We are done sitting shocked on the sidelines," Laser said of the coalition.
But despite the pronouncements of religious leaders, gun rights supporters have refused to yield the moral high ground.
Larry Ward, chairman of Gun Appreciation Day, a national event slated for Jan. 19 to counter the current momentum toward more gun control, said it would also honor King.
"I think Martin Luther King would agree with me, if he were alive today, that if African-Americans had been given the right to keep and bear arms from day one of the country's founding, perhaps slavery would not have been a chapter in our history," Ward told CNN.

Among the signers are leaders representing the domestic policy, lobbying or social action arms of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the United Methodist Church, the Presbyterian Church (USA), the Episcopal Church, the African Methodist Episcopal Church, the Progressive National Baptist Church and the National Council of Churches, the Reform, Conservative and Re-constructionist movements in Judaism, and the Islamic Society of North America.
Few evangelical Christian leaders have signed onto the effort - with the exception of the politically liberal evangelical advocacy group, Sojourners.
A survey taken<http://www.nae.net/resources/news/862-most-want-more-gun-regulations> in December by the National Association of Evangelicals, after the shootings at the Sandy Hook Elementary School, found that 73 percent of that group's leaders said the government should increase regulation of guns. The National Association of Evangelicals<http://www. nae. net>> is the nation's largest umbrella group of evangelical Christian denominations and organizations, and the survey gauges the attitudes of the association's board of directors.

WASHINGTON - A coalition of religious leaders is calling for the federal government to impose three major gun control measures: ban assault weapons and ammunition magazines, mandate background checks for all gun sales and make gun trafficking a federal crime.
The coalition, Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence, came to the United Methodist Building behind the Capitol on Tuesday to announce its proposals.
"Gun violence is a moral issue," said Vincent DeMarco, national coordinator for Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence and public health lobbyist. DeMarco played a role in advocating Food and Drug Administration regulation for tobacco 10 years ago. He said the same vigilance will help with gun control.
The group is sending a letter to Congress signed by religious leaders representing 40 different faiths, outlining the details of the reforms advocated by Faiths United. The letter, which will also be distributed to congregations across the country, highlights recent tragedies caused by gun violence, from Newtown, Conn., to Oak Creek, Wis.
"Our faith overcomes our politics," said the Rev. Jim Wallis, president and CEO of Sojourners, a Christian ministry in Washington, D.C., dedicated to social justice.
DeMarco said that gun control will not interfere with the rights of lawful gun owners, responding to concerns about Second Amendment rights.
"Congressmen will realize 90 percent of their constituents support this," said DeMarco.
On Monday, Maryland Gov. Martin O'Malley discussed his gun control policy with New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg at a gun violence summit at Johns Hopkins University. O'Malley plans to release a legislative package calling for an assault weapons ban and tougher licensing requirements. O'Malley said in a quote to the Associated Press, "This will be a comprehensive legislative package to prevent gun violence, and it addresses not only the guns, but also mental health and school safety." DeMarco's group and O'Malley are asking the federal government to administer strict background checks for anyone wishing to purchase a gun.
Faiths United's news conference coincided with Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday, who was an advocate
for gun control and victim of gun violence.
The Rev. J. Herbert Nelson, director of Public Witness Presbyterian Church USA, said, "If he were alive today, this issue would be a priority."

Representatives of a range of national Catholic groups, including those speaking for the country's sisters, brothers, priests and bishops, signed a letter Tuesday calling for stringent new national gun control measures.
The 14 Catholic signers are among more than 40 leaders of a range of faith groups organized under the aegis "Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence."
In a letter to congressional representatives Tuesday, the leaders, who include the heads of a number of prominent Protestant, Muslim, Jewish and Hindu groups, write that "no more time can be wasted" following the December shooting in Newtown, Conn.
"Gun violence is taking an unacceptable toll on our society, in mass killings and in the constant day-today of senseless death," write the signatories, who include Stockton, Calif., Bishop Stephen Blaire, chairman of the U.S. bishops' Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development.
"While we continue to pray for the families and friends of those who died, we must also support our prayers with action. We should do everything possible to keep guns out of the hands of people who may harm themselves or others."
Among action needed to stem gun violence, the leaders propose
rules<http://faithsagainstgunviolence.org> mandating that every person buying a gun pass a criminal background check; that high-capacity weapons and ammunition be banned; and gun trafficking be made a federal crime.
Included in the other Catholic representatives signing the petition are leaders of both the Leadership Conference of Women Religious, which represents about 80 percent of U.S. Catholic sisters, and the Conference of Major Superiors of Men, which represents U.S. Catholic brothers and priests in religious orders.
The letter from the faith groups comes as President Barack Obama is expected to announce a plan to reduce gun violence in the country, possibly by executive order, this week following recommendations from a task force set up by Vice President Joe Biden.

Together, they have held news conferences, written to Vice President Joe Biden's gun control task force and sent letters to Congress.
On Jan. 15, which would have been Martin Luther King Jr.'s 84th birthday, members of an interfaith alliance known as Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence held a news conference to urge Americans to work together to help curb gun violence.

They called for a ban on assault weapons and high capacity ammunition magazines as well as improved background screening of gun buyers. They also spoke of a need to improve the way people with mental illnesses are helped.

These ideas were included in their two-page letter to Congress, which urged its members to lead the way toward a safer society that not only protects children in schools against a mass shooter, but also stops individual inner-city gun murders as well.

The letter was signed by 47 religious leaders from numerous faiths including the Jewish Council for Public Affairs, the Jewish Reconstructionist Movement, the Rabbinical Assembly, Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism, United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism and Women of Reform Judaism.

Rachel Laser, deputy director of the Religious Action Center, said at Tuesday's news conference that there has been "Enough pain. Enough despair. Enough injustice. Let us learn from our grief and the errors of the past and resolve in this very moment to do better."

Laser announced that religious leaders throughout the country will mobilize their congregants to join in an Interfaith Call to Prevent Gun Violence on Feb. 4. On that day, Americans will call their Congress member and ask that they be "held accountable for the safety of our communities."

On Jan. 14, a similar letter was sent to both the president and vice president. It, too, makes an urgent plea to address effectively the subject of gun violence. The letter was spearheaded by the Rabbinical Assembly's Rabbi Julie Schonfeld and organized by Susan Stern of the Council on Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships, and Rabbi David Saperstein of the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism.
"As religious and non-profit leaders, we commit to building consensus and support in our communities for steps that will turn our collective grief into shared hope. We acknowledge that the privilege of American freedom also carries a moral responsibility," the letter read in part.

Another letter sent to Biden's task force came from Agudath Israel of America, a national Orthodox organization in New York.
"Violent incidents that have occurred in school settings during the past number of years have demonstrated that the need for security hardware - cameras, metal detectors, barricades, etc. - is particularly compelling. Unfortunately, despite the need for increased school safely - whether in the realm of disaster preparedness or crisis management - budgets put forward by the Bush and Obama administrations - and passed by various Congresses - have significantly and steadily slashed funding for these purposes - the point where meaningful federal school safety assistance is virtually non-existent," Agudath's Rabbi Abba Cohen wrote.

Cohen also pointed out the unique threat that Jewish schools face, from outside the school and ouside the community in the form of terrorismand extremism.

More than two dozen faith-based leaders marked Martin Luther King, Jr.'s 84th birthday by urging Americans to work together to help curb gun violence.
Under the umbrella group, Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence, the religious leaders gathered inside the United Methodist Building in D.C. Jan. 15 and called for a ban on assault weapons and high capacity ammunition magazines as well as improved background screening of gun buyers. They also spoke of a need to improve the way people with mental problems are helped.
They sent a two-page letter to Congress urging its members to lead the way toward a safer society that not only protects children in schools against a mass shooter, but also stops individual inner-city gun murders as well. The letter was signed by 47 religious leaders from numerous faiths.
Jewish groups signing onto the letter to Congress include the Jewish Council for Public Affairs, the Jewish Reconstructionist Movement, the Rabbinical Assembly, Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism, United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism and Women of Reform Judaism.
"Gun violence prevention is a moral issue," said Vincent DeMarco, national coordinator of Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence. He started this group almost two years ago with 24 members. There are now more than 45 , he said.
"There is power here to get it done. We are going to succeed," he said, noting the organizations represent

80 million Americans.
None of the group's gun control proposals interfere with the Second Amendment, which protects the right of people to keep and bear arms, DeMarco stressed.
He said that according to both conservative and liberal polls, the vast majority of Americans support some form of gun control and many of those supporters own guns.
DeMarco likened the call for gun control to this country's fight to limit the sale of tobacco. In that case, the people rose up, demanded curbs, and Congress followed along, DeMarco said. He said he expected the gun control movement to echo that.
Rachel Laser, deputy director of Religious Action Center, said there has been "enough pain, enough despair, enough injustice. Let us learn from our grief and the errors of the past and resolve in this very moment to do better."
"When our society worships violence and weapons, we recognize idolatry," she noted.
RAC, as well as the other organizations, will work with Congress "to achieve sensible gun violence prevention," by getting military-style weapons off the streets while pursuing improved mental-health services, pledged Laser. "We call on our communities and congregations to address the culture of violence that has pervaded our nation for too long."
Laser then announced that religious congregations throughout the country will mobilize their
congregants to join in an Interfaith Call to Prevent Gun Violence on Feb. 4. On that day, Americans will call their Member of Congress and ask that they be "held accountable for the safety of our communities."
Jared Feldman, vice president and Washington director of Jewish Council for Public Affairs, said his group has called for the curtailment of access to dangerous weapons and military magazine clips and to take a hard look at mental health issues. He also said JCPA believes this country should investigate "what can be done to end the culture of violence."
That culture includes movies, television shows and video games that glorify violence as well as bullying in schools, Feldman said.
He said it was important to keep up the momentum for gun control that arose following the Sandy Hook school killings. "We need to keep this conversation going. Political leaders are responsible to what their constituents want."
JCPA sent a letter last week to Vice President Joe Biden's task force explaining its position.
"Jewish tradition inspires our concern with issues of quality of life and public safety and compels us to uphold the sanctity of life and the commandment against murder," JCPA's letter read in part.
Several religious leaders spoke during the press conference including Sayyid Syeed of the Islamic Society of North America, who said it is important to end these mass shootings.
Of the young children killed at Sandy Hook Elementary School, Syeed said that "these young boys and girls will ask what is the crime they committed? Why were there not enough laws to regulate" gun sales. Rev. David S. Conney, a United Methodist minister, called gun control "not just good policy. It is a moral imperative."
He said while highly publicized killings gain lots of press, "everyday, there are gun deaths, \(30,000 \mathrm{a}\) year. Certainly when there is such violence, it is not a peaceful society."
Rev. Jim Wallis, president and CEO of Sojourners, referred back to a recent press conference by the National Rifle Association where it was stated that gun violence will be stopped when good people have guns.
He called that statement, "factually flawed, morally mistaken and religiously repugnant."
Wallis said the federal government is dysfunctional and "always behind the rest of the country.
Washington, D.C., is set up to allow good change from happening. That is a matter of fact," he said, noting that social change is really what makes things happen in America.
The press conference ended with a prayer by the Rt. Rev. Mariann Edgar Budde, bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Washington, D.C., who declared, "We regret Lord that it took the murder of 20 children to break our hearts, but our hearts are broken now."
Following the press conference, DeMarco said he was optimistic. "Now is the time. We need to move.

I'm focused on faith, and it's working extremely well."

Forty-seven faith leaders representing 80 million Americans joined Jan. 15 in a letter calling on members of Congress to take immediate action to prevent gun violence in the United States.
The letter<http://faithsagainstgunviolence.org/> -- made public a month after a tragic mass shooting in Newtown, Conn., and on what would have been the 84th birthday of Martin Luther King Jr. -- called for mandatory background checks for gun buyers, a ban on high-capacity weapons and ammunition magazines and making gun trafficking a federal crime.
Signatures on the letter include Carol Blythe, president of the Alliance of Baptists; Walter Parrish II, executive minister of American Baptist Churches of the South; Aidsand Wright-Riggins, executive director of American Baptist Home Mission Societies; LeDayne McLeese Polaski, program coordinator of the Baptist Peace Fellowship of North America; Carroll Baltimore, president of the Progressive National Baptist Convention; and Jim Wallis, president and CEO of Sojourners.
Wallis was among faith leaders who spoke at a press conference at the United Methodist Building in Washington announcing the initiative. Wallis quoted NRA executive vice president Wayne LaPierre's comment<http://www.npr.org/2012/12/21/167824766/nra-only-thing-that-stops-a-bad-guy-with-a-gun-is-a-good-guy-with-a-gun> in the wake of the Newtown shootings: "The only thing that stops a bad guy with a gun, is a good guy with a gun."
"That statement is at the heart of the problem of gun violence in America today," said Wallis, a member of First Baptist Church in Washington, "not just because it is factually flawed, which of course it is, but because it is morally mistaken, theologically dangerous and religiously repugnant."
The letter, coordinated by the 2-year-old Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence, referenced the Newtown tragedy along with other similar attacks including Aurora, Colo.; Tucson, Ariz.; Fort Hood in Killeen, Texas; Virginia Tech and Columbine, Colo.
"Gun violence is taking an unacceptable toll on our society, in mass killings and in the constant day-today of senseless death," the faith leaders sad. "While we continue to pray for the families and friends of those who died, we must also support our prayers with action. We should do everything possible to keep guns out of the hands of people who may harm themselves or others. We should not allow firepower to kill large numbers of people in seconds anywhere in our civil society. And we should ensure that law enforcement has the tools it needs to stop the virtually unrestrained trafficking of guns."

Two days after the mass shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown, Conn., the Very Rev.

Gary Hall climbed into the stone pulpit at Washington, D.C.'s National Cathedral and delivered a fierce sermon that grabbed headlines across the country.
"Enough is enough," Hall said. "We have tolerated school shootings, mall shootings, theater shootings, sniper shootings, workplace shootings, temple and church shootings, urban neighborhood shootings, for far too long. The massacre of these 28 people in Connecticut is, for me at least, the last straw."
Hall went on, "The best way for us to mourn the Sandy Hook shooting is to mobilize the faith community for gun control ... we know both from faith and experience that the cross is mightier than the gun. The gun lobby is no match for the cross lobby."
Four days after his sermon, Rev. Hall joined a press conference of interfaith leaders, who called for the religious community to act collectively to end gun violence and to demand swift action from political leaders to pass common-sense gun laws. In the days since, pressure has continued to mount, and more faith-based groups are calling for action.
A coalition called Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence, which came together after the shooting of former U.S. Rep. Gabby Giffords (D-AZ) two years ago, has drafted a public letter to President Barack Obama and Congress with the following three legislative demands: require a criminal background check for every gun sold in this country, ban assault weapons and high-capacity ammunition magazines and make gun trafficking a federal crime. Coalition members are holding a press conference on Jan. 15 to release the letter and to urge action.
PICO, a national faith-based organizing group, is also calling for a ban on assault weapons and background checks on gun sales. "Praying is not enough," said Rev. Michael McBride, head of PICO's Lifelines to Healing campaign. "We must turn our prayers, grief, and outrage into action ... the majority of Americans support these sensible proposals."
Over the past weekend congregations across the country participated in a Gun Violence Prevention Sabbath, where they heard sermons, prayed and pledged action. New voices are joining those who have been working on this issue for years. Heeding God's Call is active in Pennsylvania, while houses of worship in Chicago, Los Angeles, and other cities such as New York and Boston have long been involved in antigang and gun violence efforts.
For too long, the work of many of these groups attracted little public notice. Hopefully, however, that will now change. A broad-based movement is coming together that includes African American and Latino churches, white evangelicals, Jewish, Muslim, Sikh, Buddhist, Catholic, and other faith communities. They will not be easily dismissed.
Indeed, their clout will be essential in the coming days in order to transform moral outrage into common-sense legislation. According to news reports, the White House is considering a broad range of comprehensive measures to reduce gun violence. These include uniform background checks on gun buyers, a national database to track the sale and movement of guns, stronger mental health checks and more.
Officials at the National Rifle Association, after laying low for a week in the wake of the Sandy Hook shooting, have come out more defiant than ever. The NRA's Executive Vice President Wayne LaPierre called for armed guards in every school and blamed the Sandy Hook shooting on violent entertainment and lax mental health policies. Notably, LaPierre did not say one word about the role of his organization's lobbyists in gun violence.
It is clear that NRA officials are hoping public attention will soon wane and drift to another issue, as it has in the past, and that the pressure to act will die down. They are callously hoping that our collective moral outrage will be sapped by arcane policy fights and by a mass of legislative details too complex for sound bites. They want to outwait and outwit the rest of us.
But this time is different. People of faith are joining millions of Americans of all political stripes to demand common-sense gun policies. As Cardinal Theodore McCarrick, the former archbishop of Washington (D.C.), said at the interfaith press conference, "We get to a moment where we can't take it anymore. We've got to rededicate ourselves to who we are."
It's time to pull back the curtain on the gun lobby, to shame them and their political allies for sacrificing thousands of American lives each year to an extremist ideology that lacks the support of most

Americans.
Since the mass shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School on Dec. 14, more than 500 people have been killed by guns in America. Every day the number rises. It is long past time to echo what Rev. Hall said in his sermon at the National Cathedral: "Enough is enough."

As New York legislators prepare to pass the strictest gun control law in the nation and Vice President Joe Biden leads a task force on the White House's response to gun violence, a group of religious leaders are joining in Washington, D.C. to demand quick action on gun control.
The group, Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence, is holding a press conference Tuesday at the United Methodist Building, which is just around the corner from the White House, and delivering a letter to President Barack Obama and Congress signed by 40 national religious leaders urging action on guns. HuffPost obtained an early copy of the letter and list of signees. Their demands: "Every person who buys a gun should pass a criminal background check," "high capacity weapons and ammunition magazines should not be available to civilians" and "gun trafficking should be made a federal crime." Take special note of this: "The weapons had been stored in a closet not a gun safe." And it could have been even worse: "... authorities believe Nehemiah [after murdering his family] put several loaded weapons, including the assault rifle, in the family van with the plan to drive to the nearest Walmart, gun down more people and eventually die in a shootout with police."

It was a "horrific" crime scene that confronted deputies Saturday night: Pastor Greg Griego, his wife, Sarah, and their three youngest children lay dead - fatally shot multiple times with an assault rifle and other weapons - at their South Valley home.

The suspect in custody is the couple's 15 -year-old son, Nehemiah Griego, who authorities believe shot and killed his mother, young brother and two young sisters about 1 a.m. Saturday, and then lay in wait for five hours before ambushing his father when he came home.

The Journal also has learned that authorities believe Nehemiah then put several loaded weapons, including the assault rifle, in the family van with the plan to drive to the nearest Walmart, gun down more people and eventually die in a shootout with police.

But Nehemiah called a friend first, who talked him into
meeting at Calvary church, where Nehemiah's father had been a pastor. It was apparently a Calvary church security officer who contacted 911 about the slayings at the Griego home late Saturday

Nehemiah Griego is now in the Bernalillo County Juvenile Detention Center, charged with two open counts of murder and three counts of child abuse resulting in death.

The couple had 10 children, but only the three youngest and Nehemiah were at home during the shootings

The sheriff's office has identified the victims as Greg Griego, 51, a former pastor at Calvary Chapel, as well as at the Metropolitan

Detention Center; his wife, Sarah Griego, 40, a stay-at-home mom who home schooled their children; Zephania Griego, 9; Jael Griego, 5; and Angelina Griego, 2.
"I've never seen a scene quite like this," Bernalillo County Sheriff Dan Houston told reporters at a news conference Sunday morning.

\section*{Shot in their beds}

Throughout Sunday, the sheriff's office released few details.

But the Journal has learned that sheriff's investigators found multiple weapons at the Griegos' home, including an AR-15 semiautomatic assault-style rifle and a 22 caliber pistol. It appears Nehemiah used both weapons in the slayings, although it was not immediately clear which guns he allegedly used to kill which of his family members.

The Journal also has learned more details about what detectives believe unfolded at the Griegos' home in the small hours of Saturday morning. They include:

Nehemiah had a minor disagreement with his mother on Friday night. He waited for her to go to sleep in her bedroom. About 1 a.m. Saturday, he went into his mother's room and shot her multiple times.

His 9-year-old brother was sleeping in the bed, too, and as he woke up, Nehemiah told the youngster he had just killed their mother. He then shot his brother multiple times.

In a nearby room, Nehemiah's young sisters began to scream and cry. He walked across the hall and into their room, then opened fire, shooting them both multiple times.

Nehemiah next went downstairs and waited several hours for his father to come home. His father arrived about 6 a.m., and Nehemiah shot him multiple times.

After the killings, Nehemiah put the AR-15 rifle and a shotgun, both of which were loaded, into the family's van and drove away.

His plan was to head for the nearest Walmart. Once there, he planned to kill several people and wait for police to arrive. Ulimately, he planned to spark a gunfight with law enforcement and die in a hail of bullets.

But first he called a friend who convinced him to meet at Calvary Chapel.

Law enforcement are still trying to piece together what happened over the next 12 hours. But it appears that Nehemiah spent much of that time at the mega church on Osuna.

Eventually Nehemiah told a church security guard, who was a retired police officer, that someone had killed his family at their South Valley home.

The security guard and Nehemiah drove to the home. The guard looked inside, saw Greg Griego dead on the floor and called 911 . It was about 9 p.m.

Authorities believe Nehemiah's parents owned the guns. The weapons had been stored in a closet, not in a gun safe.

They also believe Nehemiah may have had violent fantasies including killing and murdersuicide scenarios for much of his life.

Nehemiah Griego was not well-known among those living within a block or so of the family's home.

However, neighbor Peter Gomez said he saw the boy walk with siblings and his parents through the neighborhood regularly, and he "wore nothing but camouflage stuff."

Another neighbor said Nehemiah wanted to be a soldier. Although he always wore Army clothing and camouflage, Nehemiah wasn't allowed to play violent video games, the neighbor said, since the boy's parents didn't allow anything "dirty or violent" and limited TV watching.

\section*{5 dead in New Mexico shooting}

A teenage boy with several weapons including an assault rifle shot and killed five people, three of them children, at a house in Albuquerque, New Mexico, authorities said on Sunday.

The boy, whose exact age had yet to be determined, was arrested and charged with the killings which took place late Saturday night, said Aaron Williamson, a Bernalillo County Sheriff's Department deputy.
"The victims all had multiple gunshot wounds, and there appeared to be multiple weapons, including an assault type weapon," Williamson said.

The children appeared to be "elementary- to middle-school age," Williamson said. The boy was charged with two counts of murder and three counts of child abuse resulting in death, he said.

He said it had not been determined whether the weapons were from inside the house or brought from somewhere else.

It also was not yet clear whether the five people killed were related or what the relationship was between the teen and the victims.

The nation remains on edge about gun violence after a man killed 20 schoolchildren and six adults at a Connecticut elementary school in December using an assault rifle, sparking a renewed debate about gun control.

President Barack Obama has proposed a new assault weapons ban and mandatory background checks for all gun buyers, and New York on Tuesday broadened its assault weapons ban and restricted the allowed capacity for ammunition magazines.

Several other states also are considering whether to tighten gun controls.

The use of assault weapons is legal in New Mexico, although state lawmakers are considering bills that would tighten gun control laws and require background checks for nearly anyone buying a firearm.

Schools Hit by Morality of WalMart Guns Funding Charity
}

Since the Academy of New Media Middle School <http://www.newmediamiddle.org/> in Columbus, Ohio <http://topics.bloomberg.com/ohio/>, opened in 2011, it has scraped by, with its principal cleaning toilets and a math teacher pressed into service as school nurse. Only \(\$ 250,000\) in gifts from the Walton Family Foundation keeps the 85 -student charter school alive.

Now, in the aftermath of the Dec. 14 massacre of 26 school personnel and pupils in Newtown, Connecticut <http://topics.bloomberg.com/connecticut/>, New Media principal Andrew Sweigard said he's worried that its angel may be tarnished. Walton family members own more than 48 percent <http://WWW.bloomberg.com/quote/WMT:US> of Wal-Mart Stores Inc., the largest seller of guns in the U.S.
"It's a dilemma," Sweigard, 27, said in his cinderblock office, furnished with a worn carpet, torn chairs, and a
snow shovel. "It's a moral issue. Can we take funding from a company that is linked to a potential disaster in our school? Do we want to associate ourselves with guns?"

Sweigard's quandary illustrates a growing tension, post- Newtown, between the Walton family's educational giving and its primary source of income -- the retail giant that Sam Walton <http://topics.bloomberg.com/samwalton/> founded in 1962. The family's foundation has given \(\$ 312.9\) million <http://wff.cotcdn.rockfishhosting.com/documents/b9d833f3-611d-4f08-8d80-713fab5144cf.pdf> to charter schools since 1997, more than any other private donor.

Wal-Mart revenue from sales of guns and ammunition increased 76 percent and 30 percent, respectively, from April to October, the company said at an October analysts' meeting.

\section*{Sold Out}

Since Newtown, Dick's Sporting Goods Inc. (DKS) <http://www.bloomberg.com/quote/DKS:US> has suspended sales at its more than 500 stores of the military-style rifles of the type used in the Sandy Hook Elementary School carnage, a Dick's spokesman said. About 1,200 of Wal-Mart's almost 4,000 U.S. stores continue to sell them, often running out of stock due to customer demand.

Jared Lee Loughner, who shot 19 people in a Tucson, Arizona <http://topics.bloomberg.com/arizona/>, supermarket parking lot in 2011 with a pistol, wounding U.S. Representative Gabrielle Giffords <http://topics.bloomberg.com/gabrielle-giffords/> and killing six people including third-grader Christina-Taylor Green, bought his ammunition earlier that day at a Wal-Mart, according to Tom Peine, spokesman for the Pima County Sheriff's Department.

Wal-Mart faces intensifying public pressure to halt sales of semi-automatic firearms, or what the gun industry calls "modern sporting rifles." Almost 300,000 people have signed petitions calling on Wal-Mart to limit gun sales, according to New York-based corporate watchdog group SumOfUs.org <http://SumOfUs.org>.

After initially declining to send a representative to Vice President Joe Biden <http://topics.bloomberg.com/ioebiden/>'s Jan. 10 meeting to discuss gun control <http://topics.bloomberg.com/gun-control/> , company officials reversed course, saying they "underestimated the expectation to attend."

\section*{School Choice}

The Walton foundation didn't respond to phone calls and e- mails. It supports charter schools <http://topics.bloomberg.com/charter-schools/> because it wants to "infuse competitive pressure" into the education system "by increasing the quantity and quality of school choices available to parents, especially in low-income communities," according to its website <http://www.waltonfamilyfoundation.org/educationreform> . Charter schools are privately run public schools that generally operate without many of the rules of traditional schools, such as union contracts.

Wal-Mart spokesman Kory Lundberg declined to address charter schools' concerns specifically.
"We recognize there are a lot of views on this topic and many ideas being considered," Lundberg said. "Over the years, we have been very purposeful about striking the right balance between serving our customers that are hunters and sportsmen and ensuring that we sell firearms in the most responsible manner possible."

\section*{In Compliance}

Wal-Mart (WMT) <http://www.bloomberg.com/quote/WMT:US> doesn't sell high-capacity magazines for military- style guns, Lundberg said. It doesn't sell handguns in the continental U.S., and firearms aren't available for purchase on the retailer's website.

The company complies with eight of 10 criteria of the "Responsible Firearms Retailer Partnership
<http://www.mayorsagainstillegalguns.org/html/partnership/partnership.shtml>," including requirements that results of background checks must be received before sales and that firearms transactions be videotaped, Lundberg said. It doesn't enforce provisions to flag buyers who had previously purchased guns from Wal-Mart that were used in crimes, he said.

Lundberg said the company has a "commitment to work toward implementing" all 10 points. Wal-Mart helped create the voluntary partnership with Mayors Against Illegal Guns, co-founded by New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg <http://topics.bloomberg.com/michael-bloomberg/>, founder and majority owner of Bloomberg News parent Bloomberg LP.

\section*{'Puzzling' Practice}

Dozens of gun violence survivors -- including former Giffords staffer Pam Simon, whom Loughner shot in the chest and wrist -- signed a Jan. 9 letter urging Wal-Mart to follow the company's 2004 pledge not to sell assault rifles. The company began selling them in 2011, Lundberg said.
"It is puzzling why a family-friendly store like Wal-Mart would sell such weapons just aisles away from the strollers and school supplies," Simon and the other survivors wrote.

Three miles from a Wal-Mart store that sells semi-automatic weapons, the 8 Points Charter School <http://www. 8pointscharter.org/about-us.html> in Jacksonville, llinois <http://topics.bloomberg.com/illinois/>, opened in 2011. It has about 100 students in grades five through eight. The Walton foundation made three gifts totaling \(\$ 260,000\) to the school, which has a budget of about \(\$ 800,000\).

While the foundation is a "friend to schools" and "made everything we did possible," it's "sad if they're doing that on the backs of mentally ill people buying guns when they have no business buying guns," said Bridget English, director of operations and family advocacy at 8 Points.

\section*{Bottom Line}
"Wal-Mart does not think about the morals of it -- they think about the bottom line," said English, 39. "They have a responsibility to get on board for legislation and reform."

The school remains interested in applying for Walton foundation grants for innovation, she said.
Edwin Jones said he helped establish a Washington-based charter school for fifth-graders in 2007 with money from the Walton foundation. He regrets accepting the funds, he said in a telephone interview. Hope Academy closed within a year because of low enrollment.
"If I could turn back time, I would not have taken the Wal-Mart grant," said the 62 -year-old Jones, a Baptist pastor involved in the Respect DC Campaign, a union-backed group that opposes Wal-Mart's labor practices <http://www.bloomberg.com/quote/WMT:US>. "What is Wal-Mart's real concern? Kids who you say you care about -- in schools, malls or theaters -- are in danger."

\section*{Educators' Decisions}

Other educational administrators said they're glad to take Walton foundation funds. Firearms sales are "a decision for the shareowners <http://www.bloomberg.com/quote/WMT:US> "" said Richard Moreno, executive director of Charter School Services Corporation, a Fort Lauderdale-based organization that helps operate charter schools and whose umbrella group received more than \(\$ 1.6\) million from the Walton foundation in 2011.
"Our support from the Walton Family Foundation is separated from what the business is," Moreno said.
Three members of the Walton family are on Wal-Mart's 17- member board <http://www.bloomberg.com/quote/WMT:US> : Chairman Samuel Robson "Rob" Walton, Jim C. Walton
<http://topics.bloomberg.com/iim-c.-walton/> and Gregory Penner -- the founder's eldest son, youngest son and Rob Walton's son-in-law, respectively.

The Walton Family Foundation -- which, like Wal-Mart, is based in Bentonville, Arkansas <http://topics.bloomberg.com/arkansas/> -- is the country's 50th largest foundation, with about \(\$ 1.3\) billion in assets. Separately, Wal-Mart's corporate foundation has about \(\$ 35\) million in assets. The Wal-Mart Foundation supports a variety of community groups and makes small grants, typically less than \(\$ 1,000\) apiece, to schools, including charter schools.

\section*{Divided Faculty}

In Columbus, debate about Wal-Mart and the Walton family donations has divided the faculty. Located across from boarded- up apartments, the Academy of New Media received \(\$ 30,000\) from the Walton foundation in startup funds in 2010 and an additional \(\$ 220,000\) in 2011. The middle school has no security guard, and doors are unlocked.

Sweigard has met with his staff since the Newtown shootings to discuss updating the security policy. A Wal-Mart 17 miles away in Lewis Center, Ohio, sells military-style weapons. In Ohio, customers who pass a background check can buy an unlimited number of firearms <htto://smartgunlaws.org/ohio-state-law-summary/> without a waiting period.

While Sweigard has reservations about the Walton donations, he would not rule out applying for its funds again. "I would not limit our ability for extra income," he said.

\section*{Financial Struggles}

Two math teachers said the financially struggling school is in no position to pass them up. The charter receives less government funding than regular public schools, and teachers wonder if it will have adequate resources and enrollment to survive another academic year.
"How do you turn down money?" said Melissa Morris, 39, a math teacher and de-facto school nurse. "You can't."

Mike Stuckey, 31, a math teacher who also drives students home in his car, said he doesn't own guns but supports Second Amendment rights. He has no problem with Wal-Mart's gun sales, he said.
"It's not up to me to criticize their financial decisions," Stuckey said. "That's part of running a business."
Tiffany Martin, 38 , whose 13 -year-old son Kendall is an eighth-grader at New Media and a forward on its basketball team, likened the Walton foundation's donations to the state lottery's contributions to public education.
"They take an evil and give to something good and think it's all forgiven," Martin said.
